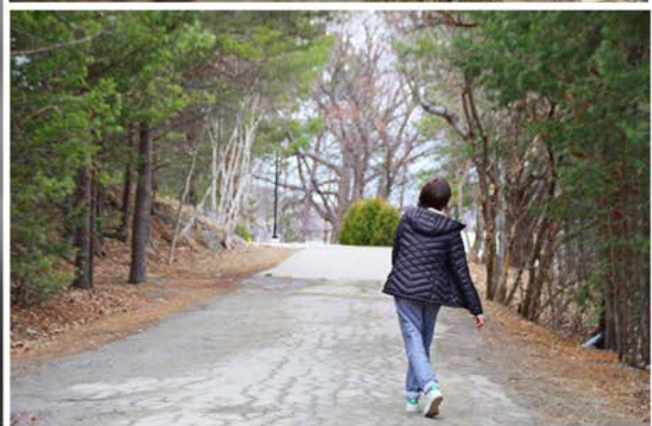

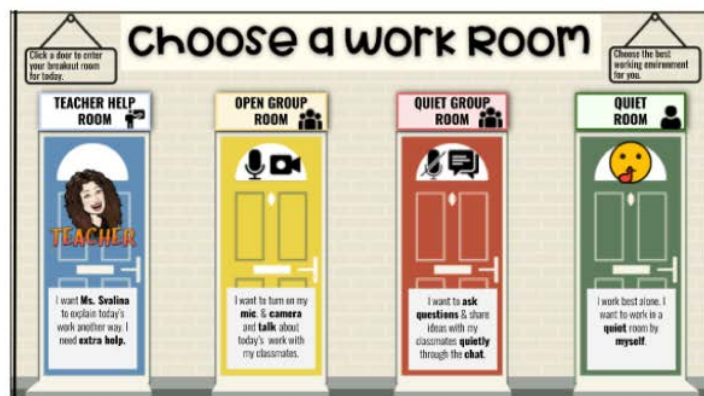

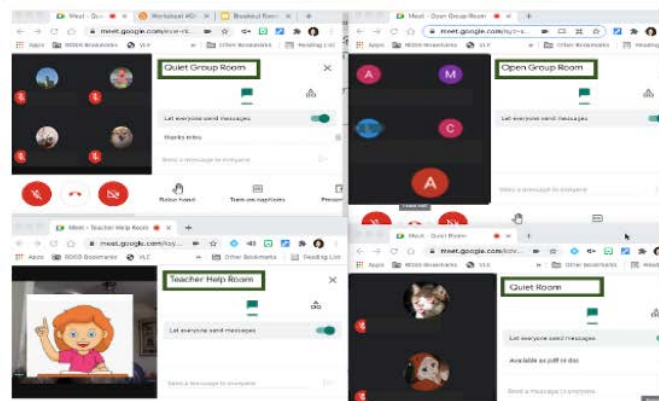
BREAKOUT MATHEMATICS

During this latest learn-at-home period, our Mathematics students have had the opportunity to select how they want to spend their problem-solving practice time. In our Google Meets platform, students can select a 'door' and enter a 'Meet Room' based on their preferred working environment!



Our Vikings 'Mathematics Teacher Help Room' allows for students who need extra help to continue working with their teacher. The 'Open Group Room' allows for students to interact with peers through voice and visuals. The 'Quiet Group Room' allows for group work with minimal noise interruptions. Lastly, the 'Quiet Room' allows students to work in a quiet space individually.

SCHOOL COUNCIL NEWS

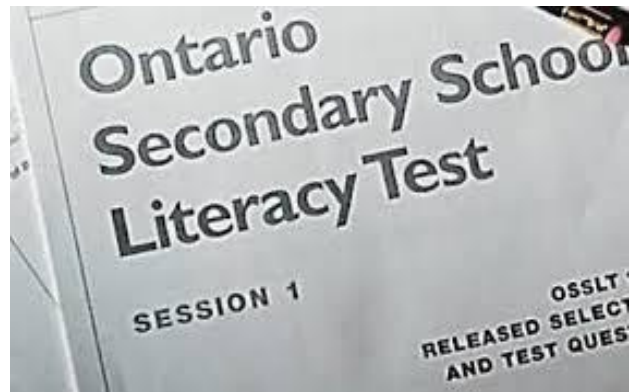

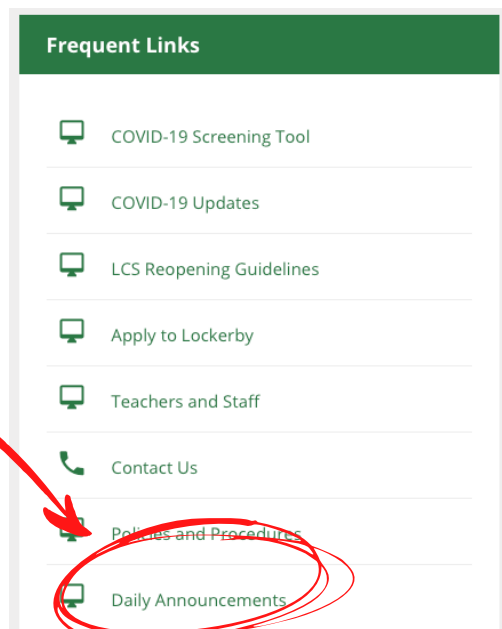


APRIL (FORMERLY MARCH) BREAK REMINDER

Transition to Post-Secondary

College Offers Acceptance - Saturday, May 1st, 2021

Applicants must confirm their acceptance of an offer of admission by Saturday, May 1st, 2021. This deadline includes students who are planning to attend the Bachelor of Science in Nursing Programs. For additional details, students are encouraged to visit the OCAS website at <https://www.ontariocolleges.ca/en/apply/offers-of-admission>

Please note that the colleges require payment of a tuition deposit in June to secure a spot in a program. Each college sets its own tuition deposit amount and payment deadline. This information will be communicated to you by the college. It is important that you adhere to the deadlines as you will risk losing your spot if you do not meet the specific dates.

University Offers Acceptance - May/June 2021

Thursday, May 27th, 2021 is the latest date that all high school applicants (who submitted their application by the January application deadline) can expect a response from an Ontario university. This response includes: an offer of admission, a refusal, or a deferral.

Tuesday, June 1st, 2021, is the earliest date Ontario universities may require a response to an offer of admission and a financial commitment of any kind (e.g., registration deposit, residence deposit). 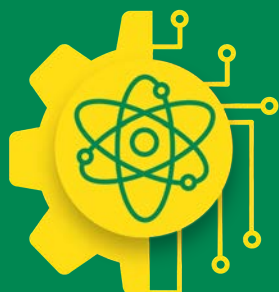
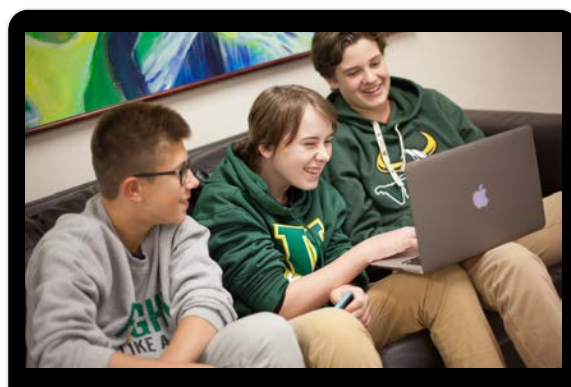


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
