WATER SAMPLING - GRADE 10 STEP

Students in Mr. Abols' Grade 10 STEP Science class become Environmental Quality Analysts this week. Our Vikings analyzed water samples taken at Copper Cliff in order to determine correlations between acidity and the location points of their samples. Partnering with Vale, students learned about mine tailings (waste material) in the Sudbury area. Mine tailings contain metal sulphides and sulfates, which when exposed to the air and water can form sulfuric acid. Of course, all the water from all of the Vale properties, sites, facilities, are treated before being released to the environment.






BEANS!






STOMATA OR GUARD CELL?



They are expected to arrive by the end of November. Students can begin the application process once they receive their individual numbers.

Student Services will be hosting a Google Meet on Wednesday, November 10th, 2021 at 8:30am to provide a step-by-step look at how to apply to university. Students will be able to access the join code on the Class of 2022 Google Classroom. Students are encouraged to have at least 3 university program choices ready for this day as well as their OUAC application letter with their personal identification number (PIN). Students who have a class during this period will be provided time within the class to participate. If students have a spare or are absent they are encouraged to join this very important session from their individual location.

College Applications

Student Services completed two application sessions for college bound students this past week. A third session will be hosted on Tuesday, November 2nd, 2021 for any of the students who missed the previous two sessions. Parents and/or guardians are asked to review their graduates applications and complete the final steps including payment in the next few weeks. 


