## PLANT PROPAGATION

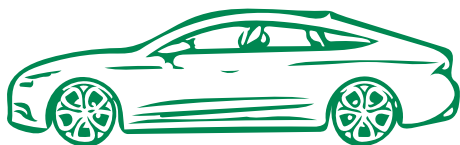

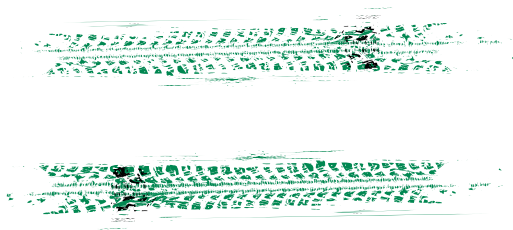


## LOCKERBY: HOME TO THE 40-MINUTE OIL CHANGE

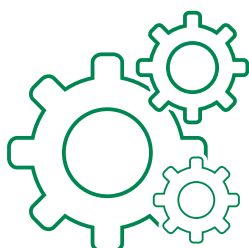

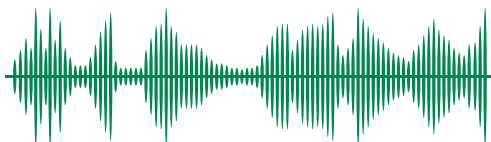
## SHSM - MINING

## WAR MUSEUM VIRTUAL VISIT

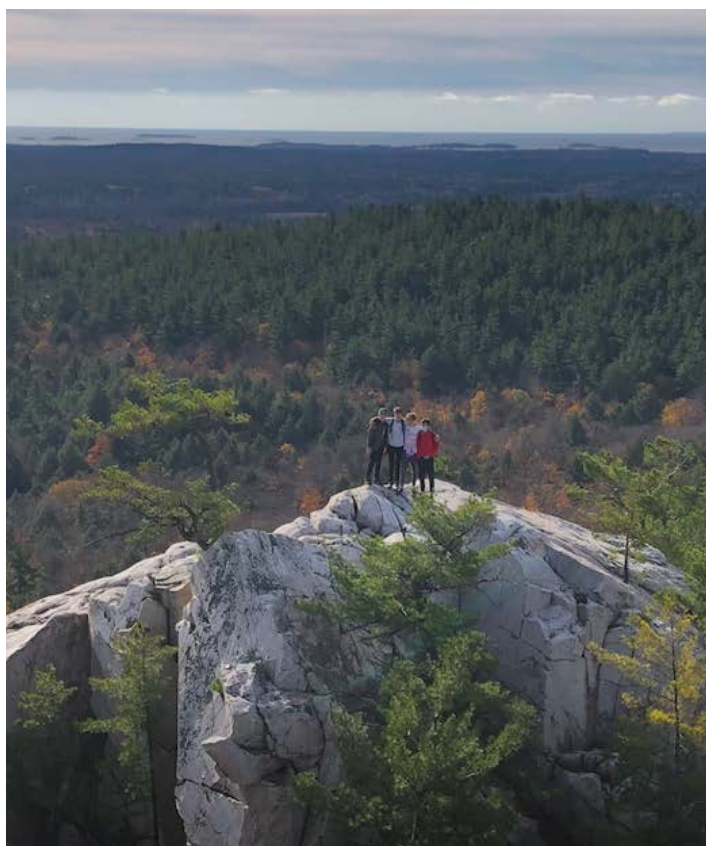

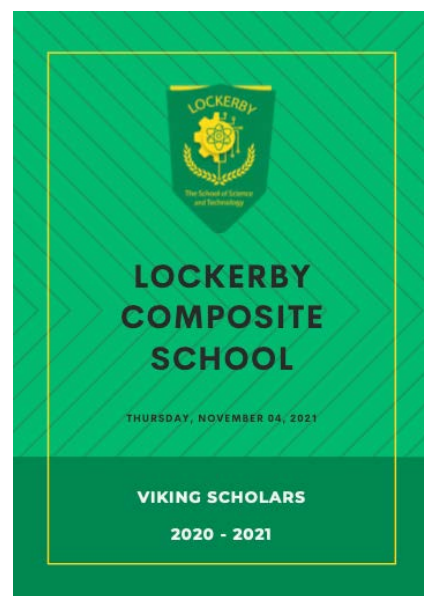


## VIKING SCHOLARS RECOGNITION

## OSSLT (LITERACY TEST)

### Practice Tests

Students will receive their feedback this coming week from their practice tests. Students are encouraged to join the 'Helpful Hints' Google Classroom (53zh57z) to find out when the virtual workshops are happening.

### Checking The List

A list and calendar with all the student writers, test dates, room location, and on-boarding dates has been shared with staff and with students in the 'Helpful Hints' Google Classroom. Students are asked to verify the information. If there are any discrepancies to contact Ms Baggs immediately at baggs@rainbowschools.

### On-boarding

Over the next two weeks teachers will be taking their students through a process called on-boarding. This is an important step in the Literacy Test process as it activates the student accounts. This activation must be completed prior to the testing date. Students will also get a chance to navigate the test site. In addition to that, each student will be provided with a school chromebook and a set of earbuds for the practice and official testing dates.

### Test Dates

Grade 11 students will be writing the week of November 15th and Grade 10 students will be writing the week of November 22nd.

### Students With Identifications

Ms. Baggs will meet with all those students a second time on Thursday, November 4th, 2021 to further discuss their accommodations. At that time she will be sharing with them a letter outlining the accommodations that they are eligible to receive.

### Virtual Workshops

Ms. Baggs will continue to host virtual workshops to support our students through this process. Upcoming dates and times will be shared via the 'Helpful Hints' Google Classroom.

By participating in this project, students will gain:

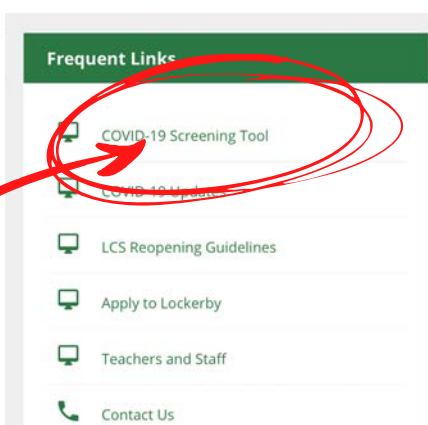
- Understanding and experience in the public sector (specifically social work)

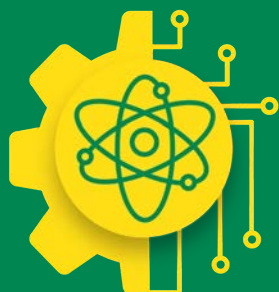
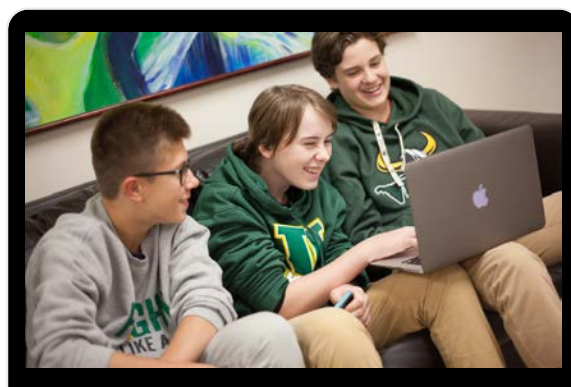
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
