

AP BIOLOGY

Students are planning and implementing a controlled experiment investigating the effects of various stimuli on isopod behaviour. This mandatory Advanced Placement lab requires an understanding of organism response to stimuli including chemotaxis, hydrotaxis, and phototaxis. The initial simplicity of this experiment belies the complexity of working with living organisms, requiring careful control of confounding variables. Turns out, these pillbugs like moisture!





COUNTING CALORIES!

Students in Grade 12 STEP Chemistry performed an experiment where they combusted common snack foods such as chips, cheesies, and marshmallows and measured the amount of heat transferred to water in a can. They then calculated the amount of calories in the substance burned.





THE GRASSVAC 3000


Some senior students in our small engines program have been busy designing and building a trailer to collect excessive grass clippings from the school football field. The project was inspired by a real life problem and has involved many drawings, prototypes, and design changes so far. Essentially, we were looking for a trailer that would collect grass clippings or leaves right from the mower deck of a tractor. The trailer had to include a gasoline powered vacuum/blower system and be able to dump a large load of clippings without the driver leaving the seat of the tractor. Students have been using the plasma cutter and mig welder and salvaging mechanical parts from various other pieces of equipment. Retail, these trailers sell for \$2000. So far we have spent \$14, and we estimate the learning value to be priceless.






BEADED POPPIES

In honour of Remembrance Day our Ojibwe Language students created beaded poppies, translated as 'Msko-Waabagoniin.' Beading is a tradition of the Anishinaabeg (Ojibwe Peoples), translated as 'Mnidoomnenske.' Meaning a spiritual act of creation that connects us to spirit, and brings a sense of peace to those beading. GRADE 11 BIOLOGY




ELEPHANT'S TOOTHPASTE

By applying a catalyst such as yeast or potassium iodide, you can speed up this reaction and create 'Elephant's Toothpaste.' I think our friend might have used too much - oops!

This week students in the transportation shop have been learning all about tires. In the classroom they investigated the parts of tire, tire sizing, and rim bolt patterns. This learning was then consolidated by performing tire changes and repairs for students and staff. Our pit crew can find the appropriate lift points for a vehicle, and follow the R.I.S.T. procedure for safe tire removal and replacement. News of our services even reached some Lockerby Alumni! In this case Mohammad dropped-in for a free winter tire change.




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
