



REMOTE LEARNING (JANUARY 5TH - 17TH)

To Our Viking Community:

As you know, and in response to recent trends that show an increase in COVID-19 hospitalizations, the government, Ontario in consultation with the Chief Medical Officer of Health, temporarily moved the province into Step Two of its Roadmap to Reopen. The Ontario government has stated that these time-limited measures will help blunt transmission and prevent from hospitals becoming province overwhelmed as the continues to accelerate its booster dose rollout. As part of the province's response to the Omicron variant, and beginning January 5, students pivoted to remote Remote learning will learning. continue to at least January 17.

Until then, keep wearing masks, sanitize hands often, continue the



practice of physical distancing, continue to self-monitor for symptoms of COVID-19 using the provincial screening tool found on our website, and stay home when feeling unwell. We know that the ebb and flow of this situation over the last few years has been a challenge – and we are certainly proud and thankful of our Viking students, staff, and parents/guardians for their resiliency and adaptability. We will continue to reach out and provide any and all updates on our website, through social media, through our weekly newsletter, and through students' Google Classrooms and VLE environments.






WHAT'S HAPPENING IN OUR ONLINE CLASSROOMS?


EVALUATIONS AND SEMESTER CALENDAR UPDATE


Laurentian Univeristy Parents/Guardians Night

Turn off chat notifications on your computer.

RE: IN-PERSON LEARNERS MOVE TO REMOTE LEARNING

Dear Parents/Guardians:

In light of the surge of COVID-19 due to the fast spreading Omicron variant, the Ministry of Education announced today that in-person learners will move to remote learning effective Wednesday, January 5, 2022 until at least Monday, January 17, 2022.

Rainbow Schools will reach out to in-person learners to complete a survey today to determine who requires technology to learn from home. Teachers will provide instructions to access the appropriate virtual platform (VLE for secondary and Google Classroom for elementary), verify email addresses, and ensure the home room/class timetable is posted within the platform.

Instruction will begin on Wednesday, January 5, 2022 for all students.

Elementary and secondary students will follow their regular schedules remotely. Teachers will connect with students to provide additional information. Students who do not have access to the Internet will receive paper based assignments.

Students who have special education needs will continue to be supported remotely by their classroom teacher and an Educational Assistant. Mental health supports will also be available.

Please continue to follow Public Health guidance:

- · Wash your hands often with soap and water or alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- · Sneeze and cough into your sleeve.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth.
- Stay home and isolate if symptoms appear.
- Practise two-metre physical distancing.
- Wear a mask at all times in indoor public spaces.
- Limit contacts to reduce the risk of exposure.

RE: FINAL EVALUATIONS IN SECONDARY SCHOOL

Dear Students and Parents/Guardians:

The move from in-person learning to remote learning, as directed by the Province of Ontario, has prompted Rainbow District School Board to review its final evaluation requirements for all secondary courses in semester 1.

As a result, we have made two important changes.

Final grades for all semester 1 courses will now be based solely on assessments completed throughout the semester. There will be no final exams or culminating activities. There will be no 30% final evaluation for courses in semester 1.

Friday, January 28, 2022 to Wednesday, February 2, 2022 will be instructional days.

These changes will maximize instructional time and enable students who may have fallen behind to recover course content. Teachers will have more time to consolidate student learning and to support the completion of late or missed assignments to assist students in earning their credits.

The changes will also mitigate the potential for staff and student extended absences due to COVID-19 and the ensuing stress this may cause for teaching and learning. Student mental health and well-being remain a priority along with health and safety.

Additional support will be provided to ensure student success. Students from the Faculty of Education have been hired to help students catch up, close gaps and rescue credits as a result of absences. Schools will focus on strategies to support students in achieving their credits.

Thank you for your ongoing patience and understanding as we adjust to COVID-19.
