4TH CHOPPED COOKING COMPETITION

Our AP Seminar students took a needed break from formulating research questions to participate in the 4th annual AP Chopped Cooking Competition. Teams were tasked with using three mystery ingredients and combining them into a tasty end product in 30 minutes. This cooking competition helps students understand the concept of synthesis: combining knowledge and ideas from different perspectives into one's own arguments.

FORENSIC CHEMISTRY - MYSTERY POWDERS

Somebody eating at a popular restaurant suddenly fell ill. A suspicious white powder was found on the victim. Grade 9 STEP Science students, as chief crime scene investigators, were tasked to identify the white powder that was collected on the victim. It may be the same substance as one of five different white powders that were stored at the location. This substance may be the cause of the illness, or it may simply be a harmless, edible cooking ingredient. They compared the physical and chemical properties of the unidentified powder to the properties of five known powders. Once the mystery powder was identified, they were able to solve the crime.

Our Grade 10 French Immersion class attempted to make a traditional tarte au sucre as a récompense for their conscientious work they completed over the past month!



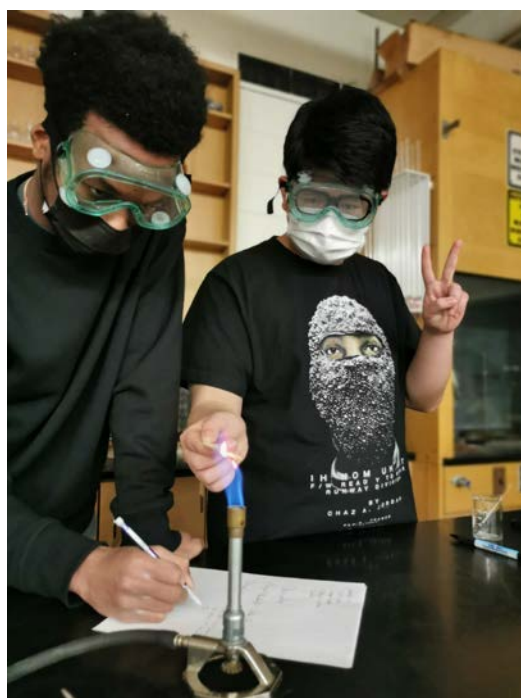
HEALTH & WELLNESS

Our Grade 12 Chemistry students were able to simulate fireworks with their bunsen burners, as they completed their spectrum laboratory.



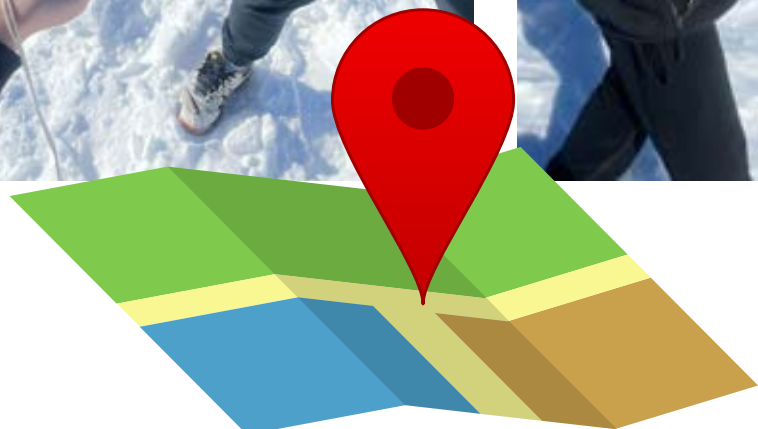
GRADE 10 SCIENCE

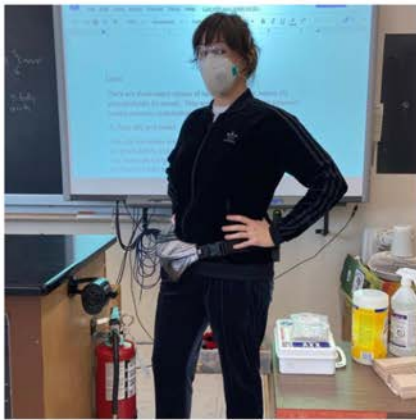
Curling

Our curlers are looking to hit the ice next week for their last league game - good luck!



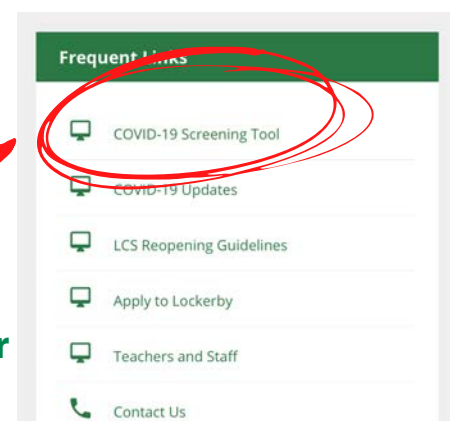
ATHLETIC ASSOCIATION SPIRIT WEEK

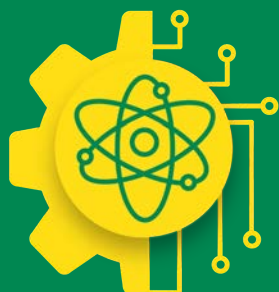
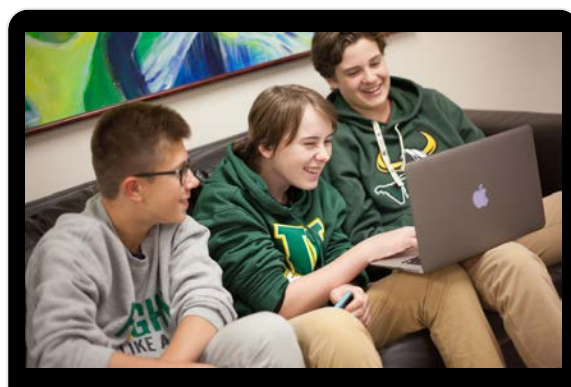
