History of Cancer Drive

Lockerby Composite School's Kids Caring for Kids Cancer Drive is an annual fundraising event where students from Lockerby raise money for the Northeast Cancer Centre through its registered charity the Northern Cancer Foundation in support of pediatric cancer care in Northern Ontario. Cancer Drive began in 1995 when one of Lockerby's former students, Laura Cotesta, was diagnosed with cancer and experienced how difficult it can be to travel out of town to receive cancer treatment. As a result, every year, our school collects money to help improve the children's cancer care here in the north. All money raised here stays here!

April is Cancer Drive Month at Lockerby

We will be kicking-off the month with the sales of brand new Cancer Drive sweaters! The sweatshirts go on sale starting Friday, April 1st, 2022 at 9:00am for \$40 per sweater. April 1st is also our Cancer Drive Spirit Day so all staff and students are asked to wear their previous Cancer Drive sweatshirts or t-shirts. All proceeds contribute to our Cancer Drive. These sweaters have yet to be revealed, so keep an eye out on the morning announcements next week! We will only be accepting payment via School Cash Online. There are detailed instructions on how to access SCO below. We only have a limited amount of sweaters, so be sure to purchase yours as soon as possible!

In addition to our sweater sales, we are hosting a pledge drive for the entire month in place of our typical Cancer Drive. On Friday, April 1st, students will receive a package in their homeroom by the members of the Cancer Drive Committee with details about how they and their family/friends can donate. We are asking you to please collect as much money as possible for pediatric cancer care through cash, cheques made payable to Northern Cancer Foundation, or online using the steps below.

- 4. Scroll down and click, "Lockerby Kids Caring for Kids Cancer Drive: Remembering Laura Cotesta"
- 5. Enter the amount you wish to donate and fill in the required fields asking for how you will be paying, and the required demographic information
- 6. Click the green "Donate Now" button at the bottom of the page

RE: PROGRESS REPORTS AND PARENT/GUARDIAN-TEACHER INTERVIEWS

As we move into our second month of our second semester, Lockerby Composite School would like to take the time to provide you with information regarding the distribution of subject Progress Reports and Parent/Guardian-Teacher Interviews.

Please be advised that Progress Reports for all classes will be distributed on Thursday, March 24th, 2022.

Subsequently, all Parent/Guardian-Teacher Interviews will be occurring virtually on Thursday, March 31st, 2022 from 3:00pm – 6:00pm (through either Google Meets or telephone calls). In order to sign-up for an interview, parents/guardians will be required to visit our school website (lockerby rainbowschools.ca) and click on the sign-up link in our banner as well as in our 'Frequent Links' section. The sign-up link will be available from March 24th – 28th, 2022. When visiting our website to sign-up for an interview, parents/guardians will be asked to follow these steps:

- 1. Have the names of your student's teachers ready;
- Use the tabs at the top of the sign-up page to locate each teacher that you wish to meet and click on the appropriate teacher tab;
- 3. Within each teacher tab, you will be asked to select an available time (if there aren't any times that work for you, or if you require a lengthier discussion, parents/guardians are asked to please contact their student's teacher to setup an alternate meeting). Having said that, please note that interviews will not be 10 minutes in length (as indicated in each tab), as teachers will need a few minutes to prepare/contact their next appointment;
- 4. Parents/guardians will then be asked to supply both an email address and a telephone number, as the interviews themselves will be conducted either by (1) a Google Meet (a follow-up email will be sent with the Google Meet code); (2) a telephone call (a follow-up email may or may not be sent); or (3) an email exchange;
- Ultimately, the information that is provided during this sign-up process will be used by teachers to connect with parents/guardians during the assigned time (eg. emails for Google Meets and email exchanges; phone numbers for calls);
- 6. To accommodate as many parents as possible, we have created 10-minute time slots and we are asking that both parties stick to the times allotted as much as possible. Again, please note that interviews will not be 10 minutes in length (as indicated in each tab), as teachers will need a few minutes to prepare/contact their next appointment.

As always, thank you for your ongoing support, and we look forward to connecting with you.

ENVIRONMENTAL COUNCIL

Lockerby's Environmental Council was recently treated to a presentation from one of its own members, Adam S. Adam was a Canada Wide Science Fair Finalist in 2019, which inspired him to continue his studies on Tire Wear Particles (TWP) this past year. He teamedup with the Junction Creek Stewardship Committee and sampled 23 sediment and 12 water samples to examine the accumulation of tire wear particles (TWP) in Junction Creek. After performing the density separation, filtration, digestion, and identification procedures on each of the samples, 2,358 microplastics were found and of which, 550 microplastics were tire wear particles!

A Guide on Tire Wear Particles

Friction between tires and the road breaks down the tires and release TWP.



Precipitation causes runoff to transfer TWP into the aquatic environment.

TWP releases carcinogenic chemicals that negatively impact living organisms and the food we eat.



Junction Creek Analysis


23 Sediment and 12 Water Samples







Water and NaCl were used to create a hypersaline solution to separate the TWP from the contents in the vessel.









The supernatant was filtered through 3 nested sieves to capture TWP in sample jars.


A vacuum filter apparatus filtered the contents of each used to identify microplastics sample jar onto gridded filter on each gridded filter paper.




Enrichment


LIBRARY SERVICES




ROUTE CANCELLATIONS




