If a graduate fails to return their gown after the evening ceremony they will incur late fees and also be responsible for shipping the gown back to Winnipeg at their own expense.

Rehearsal for Graduation - Thursday, June 9th, 2022 at 9:30am


All students who will be attending this year's graduation are required to attend the graduation rehearsal which will be occurring at the Fraser Auditorium at Laurentian University. There will be a bus provided to all students who require transportation. Students are reminded that Laurentian University has a masking mandate and requires the wearing of masks while inside any of their buildings. Students who are providing their own transportation are reminded that they are not permitted to transport other students during regular school hours.

<u>Graduation - Thursday, June 9th, 2022</u>

Our annual graduation will take place at the Fraser Auditorium at Laurentian University. Doors will open at 5:15pm. The graduation will occur at 6:00pm. Guests are reminded that they must have a ticket to enter the venue and that there is a masking mandate which requires all attendees to wear a mask while in any of the university's buildings.

This year's prom will take place at Science North's Vale Cavern the doors will open at 7:00pm with supper being served at 7:30pm. Graduates are reminded to submit their table lists in the Class of 2022 Google Classroom. SUMMER SCHOOL 2022

Registrations for Summer School are now being accepted. Students wishing to enrol in any of the 3 opportunities are asked to complete a Summer School Registration form that can be found in the Student Services Google Classroom, within this newsletter, and the Student Services office. Completed forms should be submitted to Student Services. Students will be able to register for one of the three unique opportunities including credit recovery and upgrading, summer cooperative education, and new credits via eLearning.

Credit Recovery and Upgrading

These courses will run in-person at Sudbury Secondary School, Adult Day School. Students must have completed the course they are registering for to be eligible to recover or upgrade the course at Summer School. Students enrolling in these courses must have access to a computer and the internet in case of a pivot to remote learning due to local and/or provincial restrictions.

<u>Summer Cooperative Education</u>

Students who are interested in completing an in-person cooperative education this summer will be able to earn 2 or 3 credits. The program will run for the month of July for students wishing to earn 2 credits and will also include August for the students wishing to earn 3 credits.

New Credits

Students will also have an opportunity to earn new credits this summer. These credits will be completed through an eLearning or virtual environment. A list of the summer courses can be found on the Student Services Google Classroom.

Courses will run based on sufficient enrolment so please ensure you register as soon as possible. For more information please Ms. Baggs or Mrs. Beaudry. Students are asked to return their Summer School Application Forms to Ms. Baggs or Mrs. Beaudry by Friday, June 17th, 2022, for elearning and cooperative education or Tuesday, June 28th, 2022, for Credit Recovery & Upgrading. Please come to Student Services if you have any questions or concerns or would like a paper copy of the application form.

RDSB Summer Learning Program

- ★ Register by June 17 through your school guidance counsellor.
- ★ Courses run from July 4 August 3.
- ★ Courses will run subject to sufficient enrolment and teacher availability.
- * Students can only register to complete one new credit course.
- ★ Students must be available to attend the full duration of the course to meet curriculum expectations. Timelines and due dates will not be adjusted to accommodate vacations.

New Credit Online (e-Learning) Courses

Students should expect to spend approximately 5 hours a day working in their course.

Each course is facilitated by a teacher who controls the timing of the course to encourage collaboration and enable effective feedback. Students do not work through the course at their own speed.

A variety of courses are offered through RDSB and the Ontario eLearning Consortium. If you are looking for a course not listed below please see your guidance counsellor for a full list of available courses and to register.

Note: RDSB courses run from July 4-Aug. 3, however, courses offered through other boards might have different timelines.

New Credit Co-op Courses

Students can sign up to earn co-op credits for the month of July only or for July and August together. Students can earn credits in an unpaid placement or while they are working their previously arranged summer job.

Credit Recovery or Upgrading Courses

Classes will take place in person at Sudbury Secondary, Adult Day School and are open to all students from both public and separate schools.

During the first seven days of the program, period 1 classes will run from 8:00 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. and period 2 classes from 10:45 a.m. to 1:15 p.m. Class times change on the eighth day until the end of Summer School and run from 8:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. and 10:45 a.m. to 12:45 p.m.

Note: Students enrolling in these courses must have access to a computer and the internet in case of a pivot to remote learning due to local and/or provincial restrictions. If the courses pivot to virtual learning then students will work 2.5 hours per day in a combination of synchronous (online video chat together as a group) and asynchronous (independently with teacher support) learning that will be determined by the teacher and communicated to the students.
