The Loran National Scholarship was founded in 1988 to fund outstanding students to study on Canadian University Campuses. <u>University of Toronto National Scholarship</u>

The University of Toronto National Scholarship rewards original, creative and committed Canadian secondary school students. These are students who demonstrate superior academic performance, original and creative thought, and exceptional achievement in a broad context. They excel in academic pursuits, demonstrate enthusiasm for intellectual exploration and have a strong involvement in the lives of their schools and communities. In order to apply to the Direct Pool students must be nominated by their high school. Students who would like to be considered for this year's award are asked to complete a student activity sheet and submit the completed form by September 30, 2022, to Student Services.

Schulich Leader Scholarship

Schulich Leader Scholarships are Canada's most coveted undergraduate STEM scholarships. One hundred are awarded to entrepreneurial-minded high school graduates enrolling in a Science, Technology, Engineering or Math program at 20 partner universities across Canada. Half are valued at \$120,000 for engineering scholarships and half are valued at \$100,000 for science and math scholarships. Every high school in Canada can nominate one graduating student each year to apply for the scholarship. Students who would like to be considered for this year's award are asked to complete a student activity sheet and submit the completed form by October 30th, 2022, to Student Services.

Fun can also be had in the Library by playing cards, working on a puzzle, solving a Rubik's Cube or challenging your opponent to a game of chess or backgammon!






#### MAGICAL PAWS PET THERAPY


