Next week they'll learn aseptic technique while we prepare bacteria cultures using swabs.



Some of our other Viking biologists have chosen topics that they would like to research further - luckily for the class shrimp tank, some intrepid biologists have decided to take on the care and maintenance of this ornamental shrimp colony! Students researched and are performing tank maintenance including feeding and water quality testing. Other students are working on terrariums and plant propagation, depending on their interests.
