

## LOCKERBY'S FALL FAIR

In order to promote environmental sustainability, and in preparation for Rainbow District School Board's inaugural Harvest Celebration, Lockerby Composite School hosted their Fall Fair on Tuesday. Individual classes and school groups prepared Fall-themed creations that included using outdoor materials to make Andy Goldworthy-inspired art, beading, baking (Muffins à la citrouille), creating harvest cookbooks, creating wind-powered generators, and reporting on the history of mining (to name a few)! Mr. Campeau's Communication Technology class (under Ms. Potvin's guidance) also used their newly developed graphic design skills to create various designs relating to our Fall Fair (using the open source software Inkscape). Their designs were then printed and transferred over to fabric blocks and sewn together to create the partial quilt! The class would like to thank Mrs. Potvin for all of her leadership and hard work in the creation of this project. Top Fall Fair projects will now be displayed at Rainbow District School Board's inaugural Harvest Celebration next Friday.



















# FIZZY RATE OF REACTION ACTIVITY

Students in Grade 12 STEP Chemistry designed their own laboratory to determine how various factors affect the rate of a reaction. They measured the amount of gas formed when Alka-Seltzer was added to water under varying conditions such as temperature and surface area. Most groups chose to use film canisters and measure the time it would take for the lid to pop off when a specific amount of gas was collected!

#### Getting Ready for Post Secondary Applications

Applications for Ontario Colleges and Universities are now open. Prior to completing the applications students are encouraged to continue to research post secondary opportunities as well as admission requirements. A number of post secondary institutions will be hosting open houses throughout the fall and there are a number of electronic resources that can be very beneficial. Student Services will be completing a presentation to all of our Grade 12s first period on Thursday, October 19th, 2023 to review the application process and to answer any questions students may have regarding the application process. To be considered for early admissions as well as limited enrolment programs, students must adhere to the following deadlines, for Ontario Colleges - February 1st, 2024 and for Ontario Universities January 15th, 2024.

# LITERACY TEST (OSSLT)

The OSSLT is a provincial test of literacy skills that students have acquired by the end of Grade 9. Successful completion of the OSSLT is one of the mandatory requirements to earn an Ontario Secondary School Diploma. There are two administration sessions occuring November 2023 and in the Spring of 2024.

Over the next month all eligible writers will be participating in a variety of intensive workshops with their Grade 10 classroom teachers in order to help prepare when they write the test in November. The November test dates will be shared in the coming weeks. In addition to the workshops, students will participate in a literacy diagnostic on Monday, October 16th, 2023 during Periods 3 and 4. Ms. Baggs, will be following-up with students with identifications after the diagnostic in order to finalize accommodations. Accommodation letters will be sent home with the students to share with their parents. 
