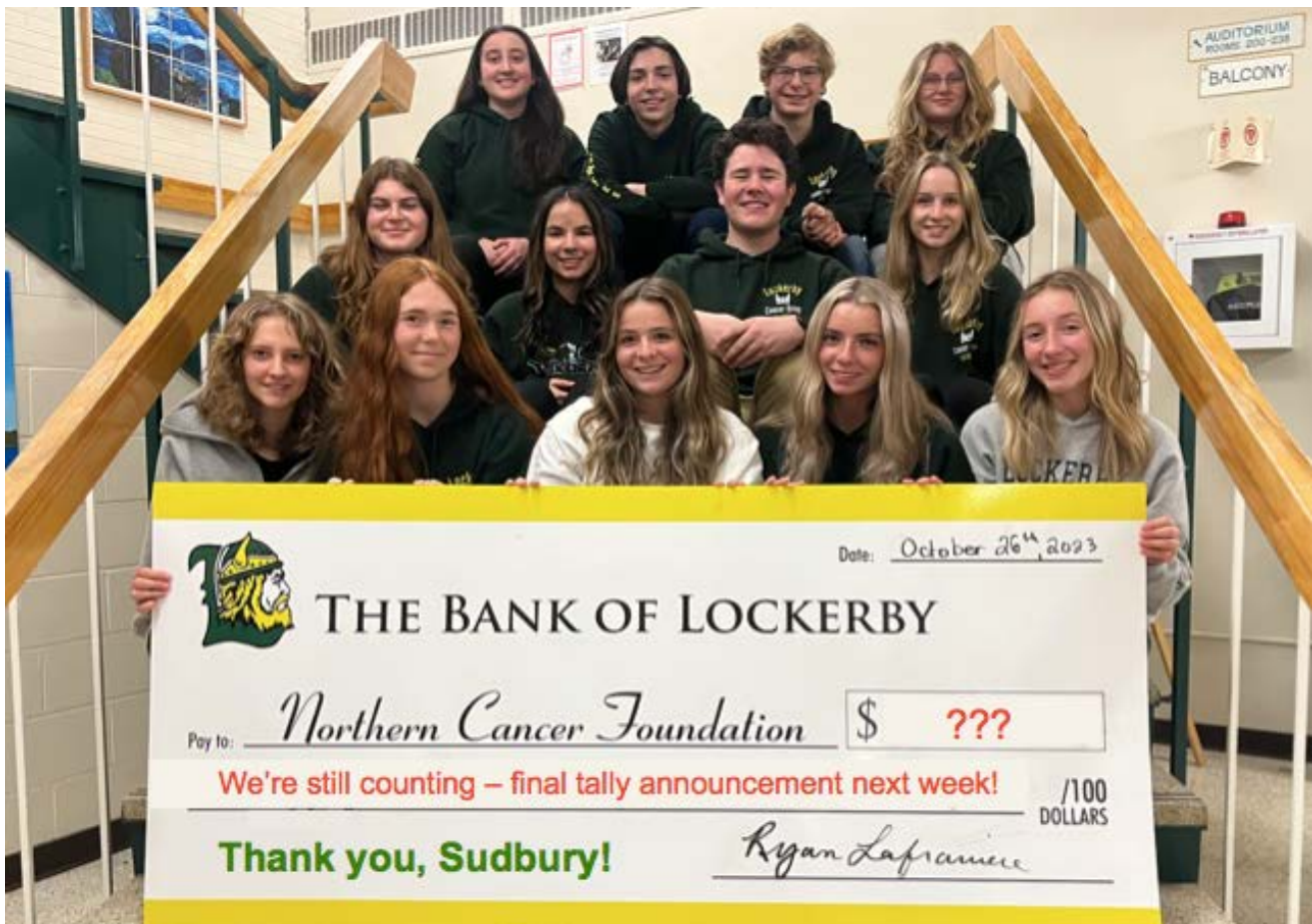

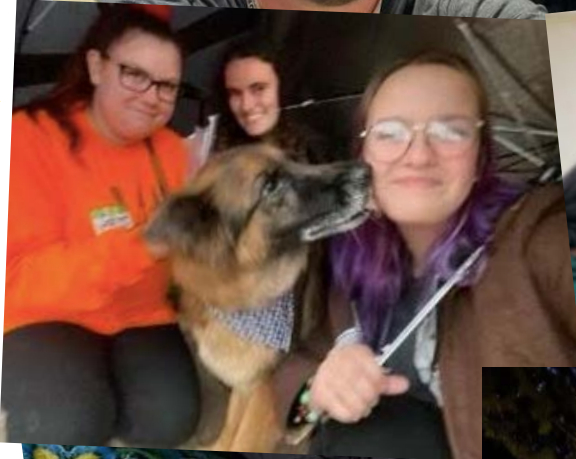


CANCER DRIVE 2023

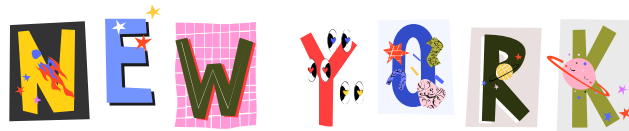
LOCKERBY'S MUSIC COUNCIL

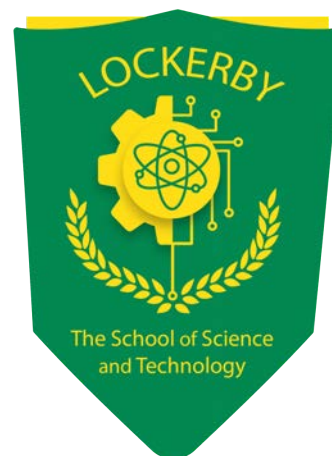
VIKING SCHOLAR AWARDS

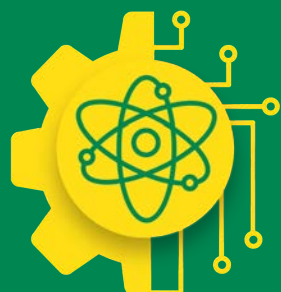
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
