
SUDBURY REGIONAL SCIENCE FAIR 2024

LCS EMERGENCE EXHIBITION



Each square on the board has a magnet carefully embedded into it so the pieces will lock into position. In addition he made custom chess pieces using Blender that were 3D printed at the school. Aryan took full advantage of the opportunity to design and build the project of his choosing.








THIS WEEK IN VIKING ATHLETICS...


