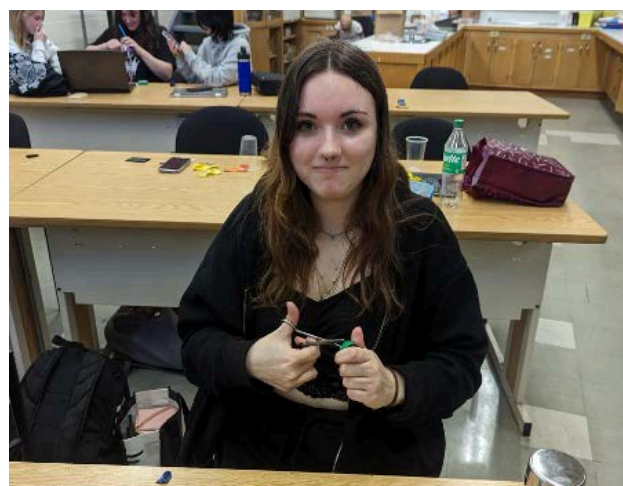
## QUEBEC TRIP 2024

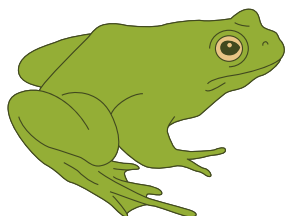
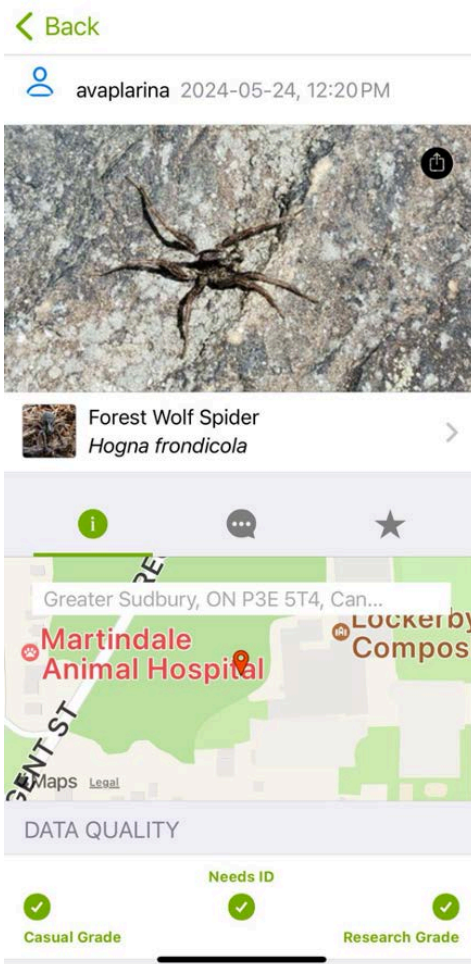
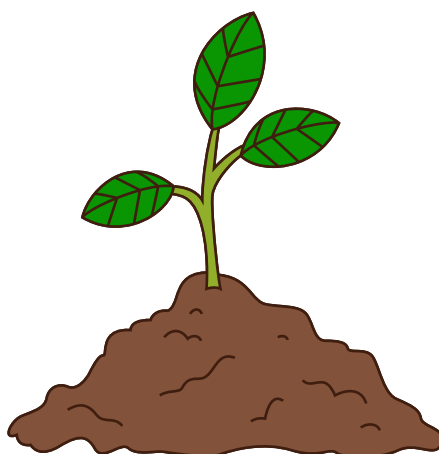
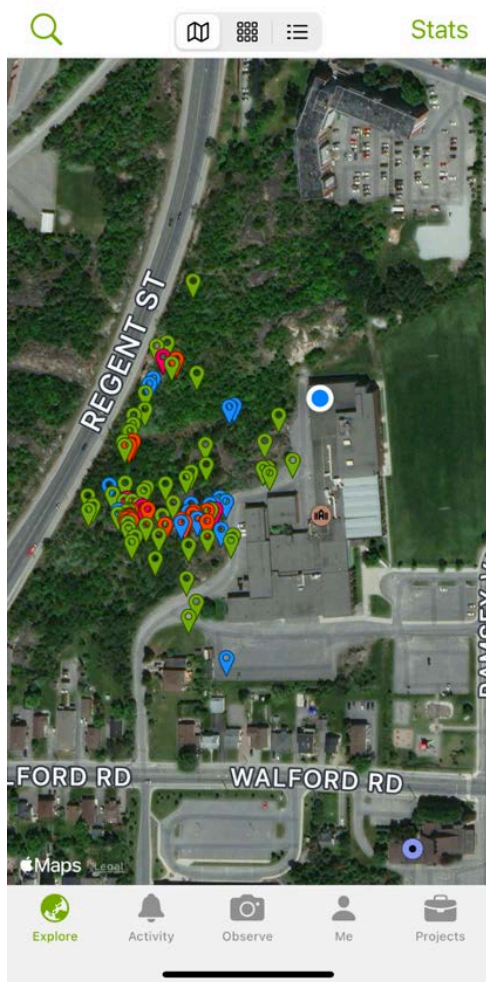
## HUMAN LUNG MODELS

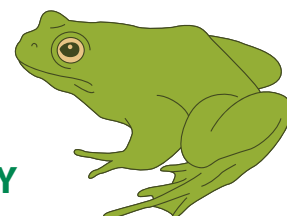
# BIOBLITZ AND I-NATURALIST CRASH COURSE

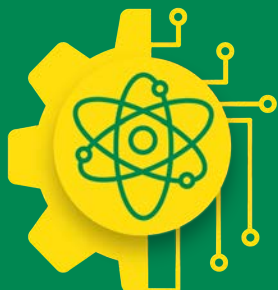
