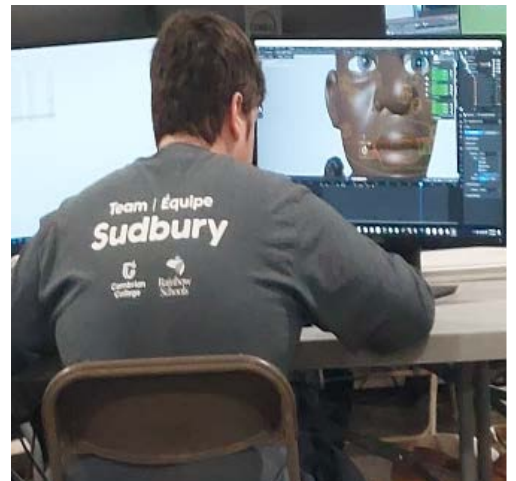
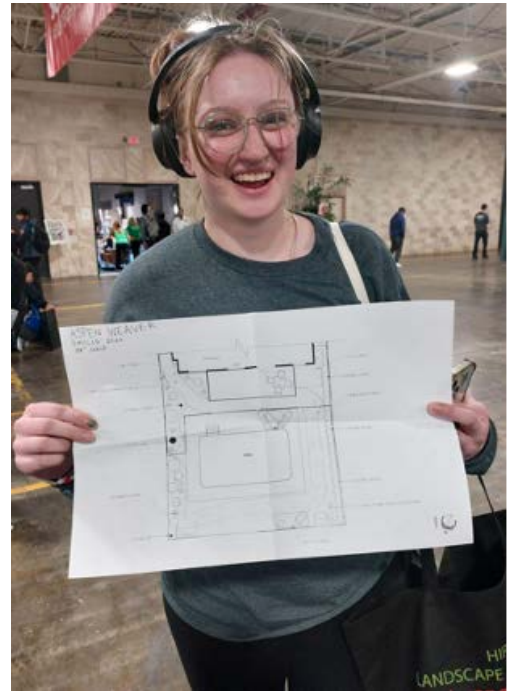

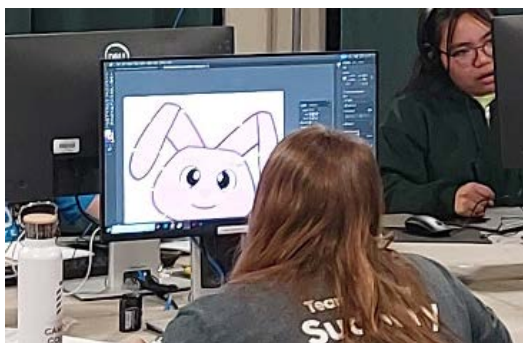


VIKINGS AT SKILLS ONTARIO

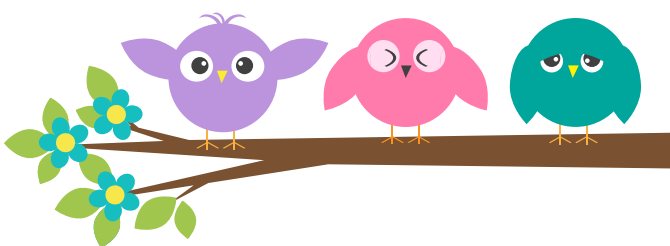
LOCKERBY ALUMNI TAKES GROUP OF LOCKERBY STUDENTS TO FORMER LOCKERBY MINE

Brad Clarke is a Senior Geologist at SPC Nickel, a former Lockerby Graduate, escorted a group of SHSM mining students to the former Lockerby Mine site located at the end of a very bumpy Gordon Lake Road (about 14km south of the Vermilion River). Once on-site the students learned how the closure of this historic mine site was being undertaken by the Ontario Government and how his company, SPC Nickel, was doing geological investigations to hopefully turn an adjacent property into a new open pit mine in the next few years. Students learned about the process of turning a prospect into a mine and even had enough time to stop at Dairy Queen on the way back to school after battling the sun and the Black Flies during their learning experience.



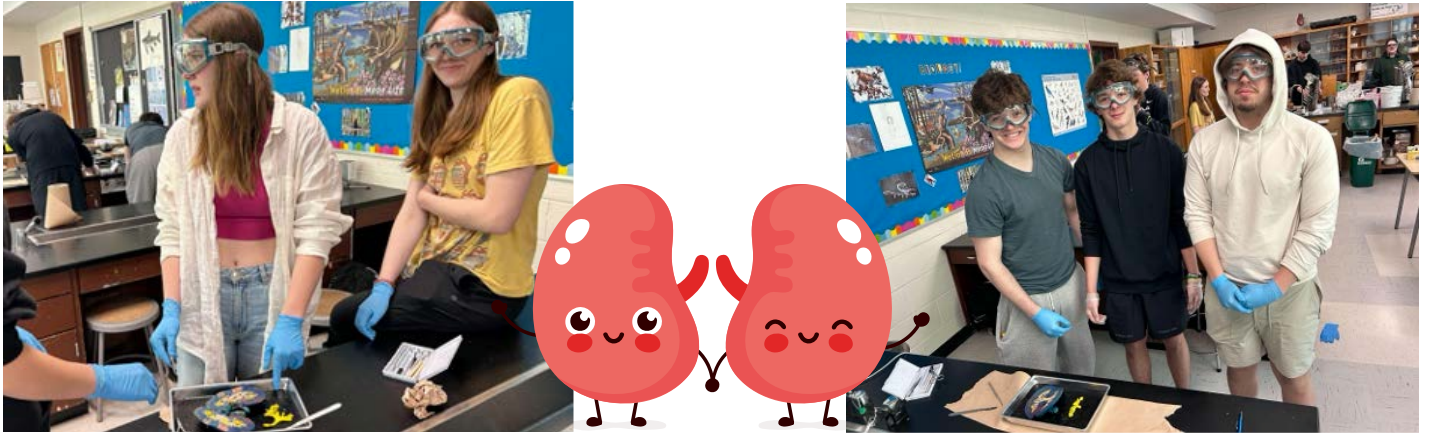
GRADE 9 SCIENCE - GETTING OUTSIDE

Grade 9 STEP Science students took advantage of the weather to observe some migratory birds right on Lockerby property! As part of their Sustainable Ecosystems unit, the class learned about the factors impacting different groups of birds, and how some bird populations are in decline due in large part to decreasing insect populations and habitat loss. Our Grade 9 STEP students discussed ways to improve plant and insect biodiversity which will in turn help these sensitive migratory birds.



KIDNEYS AND URINE FORMATION

This week, Grade 12 STEP Biology students learned in-depth about kidney anatomy and physiology. First, students completed a dissection of the kidney, where they were able to see tubules and other important tissues. Then, they completed a urinalysis activity (with artificial urine of course!). Students are about to diagnose their 'patients' based on the outcomes of the urine tests. Our Viking Biologists will also be able to connect changes in kidney function with measurable outcomes like detectable glucose or protein!



RAINBOW SCHOOLS ECOSUMMIT

Rainbow District School Board hosted its first ever EcoSummit on Wednesday in the Laurentian University Fraser Auditorium. This initiative is part of the Environmental Education Committee's ongoing efforts to nurture citizens who care about the world in which they live. Eco-leaders from Lockerby attended the green symposium to learn about environmental responsibility and how they can lead green initiatives in their respective school communities.

During the event, our Vikings heard about the science of climate change from keynote speaker Laura Myers of Learning for a Sustainable Future, a Canadian charity whose mission is to promote, through education, the knowledge, skills, values, perspectives, and practices essential to a sustainable future. Our environmental crusaders also had the opportunity to participate in three eco-workshops!



MUSIC MONDAY

This past Monday, Lockerby Composite School hosted their annual concert alongside MacLeod Public School and the Northern Brass Choir in the McKellar Auditorium. Both Viking and Mustang musicians performed with proceeds from the event supporting the Joan Mantle Music Trust.



STEP TECH

This week, students in Mr. Christie's Grade 9 STEP Technological Studies class employed the design-build focus to create Carbon Dioxide Dragsters. These dragsters were miniature racing cars which were propelled by a carbon dioxide cartridge, pierced to start the release of the gas!

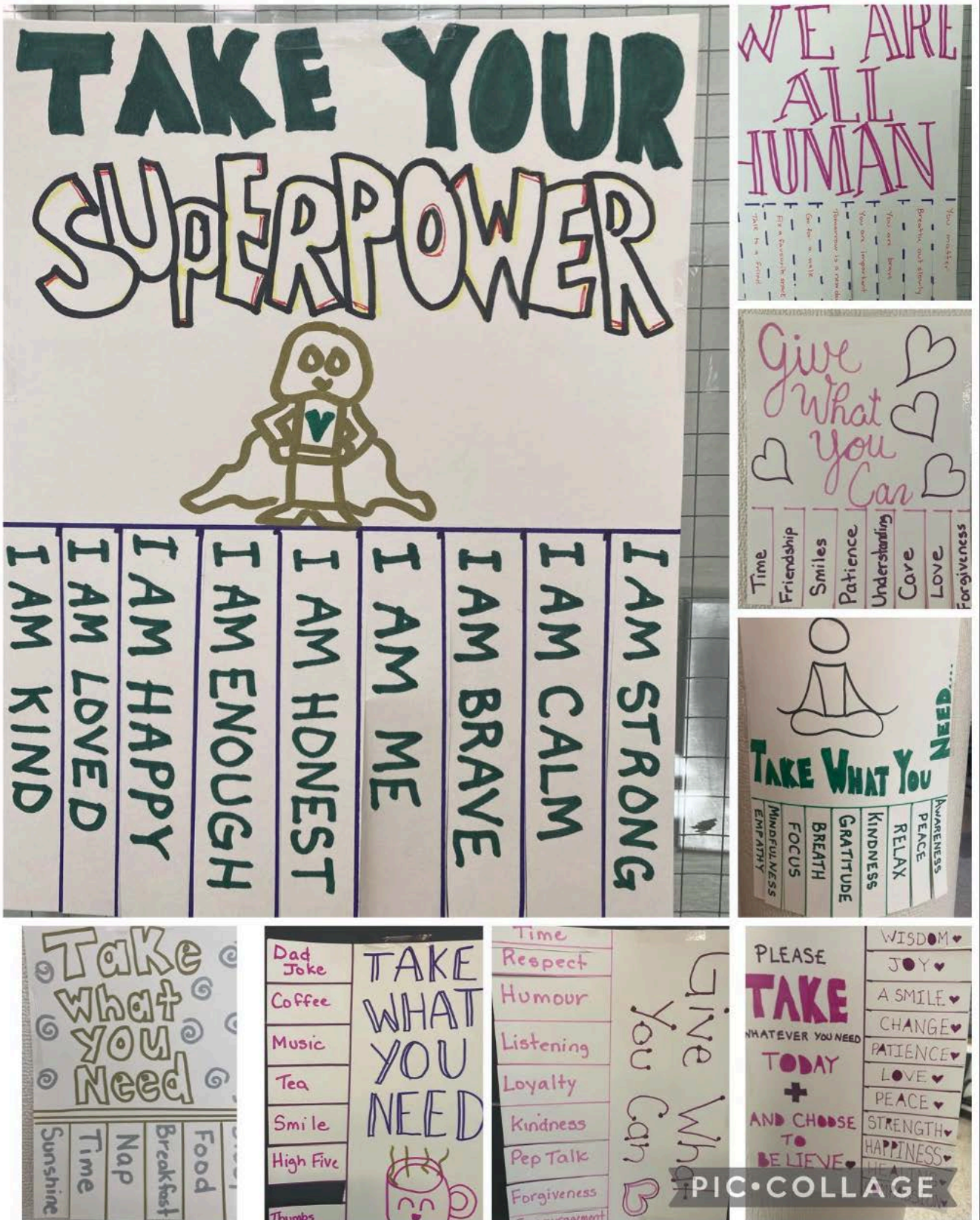

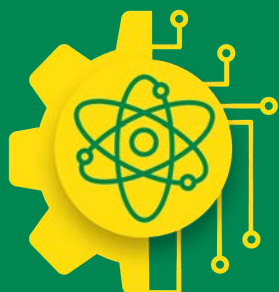
