Summer School

<u>Registration</u>

Registrations for Summer School are now being accepted. Students wishing to enrol in any of the 3 opportunities are asked to complete a Summer School Registration form that can be found in the Student Services Google Classroom, within this newsletter, and the Student Services office. Completed forms should be submitted to Student Services. Students will be able to register for one of the three unique opportunities including credit recovery and upgrading, summer cooperative education, and new credits via eLearning.

Credit Recovery and Upgrading

These courses will run in-person at Sudbury Secondary School, Adult Day School. Students must have completed the course they are registering for to be eligible to recover or upgrade the course at Summer School. Students enrolling in these courses must have access to a computer and the internet in case of a pivot to remote learning due to local and/or provincial restrictions.

New Credits

Students will also have an opportunity to earn new credits this summer. These credits will be completed through an elearning or virtual environment. Courses will run based on sufficient enrolment so please ensure you register as soon as possible. For more information please Ms. Baggs or Mrs. Beaudry.

COMING THIS FALL...

Exciting changes are coming to Lockerby Composite School.

All mathematics classes are being relocated to the second floor in new classrooms.

One of our current e-learning science rooms is being extended and converted into a modern science laboratory.

A current Technology Shop is being expanded for 21st Century learning. A 3D-printer room, fabrication space, and design-build area will be added to the traditional equipment. Another room in the area is also being converted into a STEP Integration Room and collaborative innovation space with more modern technology for the our refreshed Science Technology Education Program. There will also be a dedicated space for Lockerby Robotics.

Lockerby Composite School will also be looking at updating the aesthetics in the Library to make the space that much more welcoming for students.

In addition, renovations are currently underway to accommodate the MacLeod Public School Child Care Program for infants to preschoolers at Lockerby Composite School. The move will enable Jubilee Heritage Family Resources to offer more child care in the community, which is great news for families. It is also great news for Lockerby as we make use of surplus space.

The child care centre will be located on the back northeast side of the school, with a separate entrance and parking. The School Age Child Care Program at MacLeod Public School will be expanded to respond to the growing need for before and after school programming.

Work will progress throughout the summer as we plan ahead for the 2024 - 2025 school year.


