

Dear Parents or Caregivers:

Re: Graduation Celebrations and Toxic Drugs

With upcoming graduation, it is an exciting time for both students and parents, and a well-deserved moment for all to celebrate.

However, at Public Health, we want to ensure these celebrations happen safely. We must therefore bring your attention to the recent <u>drug warning issued by</u> <u>Public Health Sudbury & Districts</u>. There have been local reports that popular party drugs have been tainted with unknown toxic substances which have caused significant negative reactions, including overdose.

This serves as an important reminder that party drugs and stimulants, like cocaine and MDMA (also known as molly or ecstasy), may be cut and mixed with dangerous substances, including benzodiazepines (benzos), xylazine, and opioid-based drugs like fentanyl, or carfentanil. These drugs can cause significant negative reactions, including overdose.

Public Health advises that these substances should not be used when celebrating. However, where they are used, we advise that naloxone is always recommended for a suspected overdose. It could help and it will never do harm.
