STAND-UP AGAINST BULLYING

This past Thursday, Lockerby Composite students and staff wore pink for 'Stand Up Against Bullying Day.' This annual day began in Nova Scotia where secondary school students Travis Price and David Shepherd arranged for dozens of their classmates to wear pink shirts in support of another student who had been bullied for wearing pink. The Province of Nova Scotia subsequently declared the second Thursday at the start of every school year to be 'Stand Up Against Bullying Day.' This day allows our community to create a culture where all people feel safe, valued and respected, regardless of age, sex, gender identity, sexual orientation, ability, or cultural background.

STEP INTEGRATION DAYS

Our inaugural STEP Integration Days occurred this week with our Grade 9 cohort. Alces and Salmo had their first integration day on Wednesday, and Bombus, Gavia, and Ursus had their first integration day on Thursday!

STEP Integration Days are unique this year. These days allow students to work collaboratively and simultaneously with teachers from multiple disciplines (Science, Technological Design, Mathematics, and Geography). On these days, our Vikings will develop their technological building skills, they will learn about the engineering design process, and will be given the time to create, invent, design, and construct prototypes. Moreover, our STEP Integration Days allows classroom learning to be enhanced with experiential learning, field trips, and mentorships with our school's community partnerships!





NATURE IS NEAT!



After learning about classification and evolution of terrestrial plants, our ecologists set out to locate and identify key plant categories based on morphological features. Once they located representative plants, they researched using field guides, and websites such as iNaturalist, to identify their plant and determine its genus and species, thus generating the scientific name!




