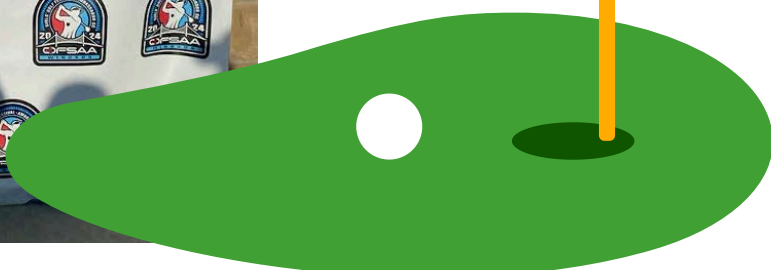
## HEALTH CARE FIELD TRIP

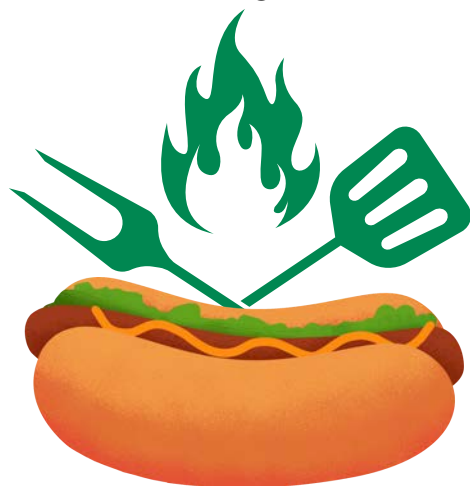


# LOCKERBY'S CANCER DRIVE

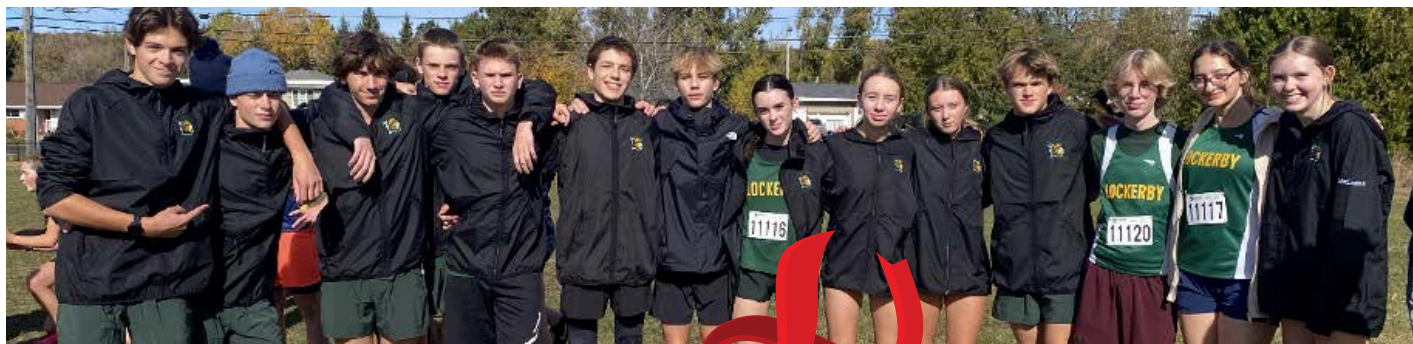

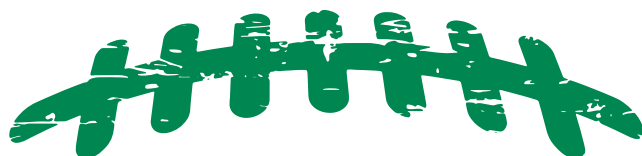
## THIS WEEK IN VIKING ATHLETICS...

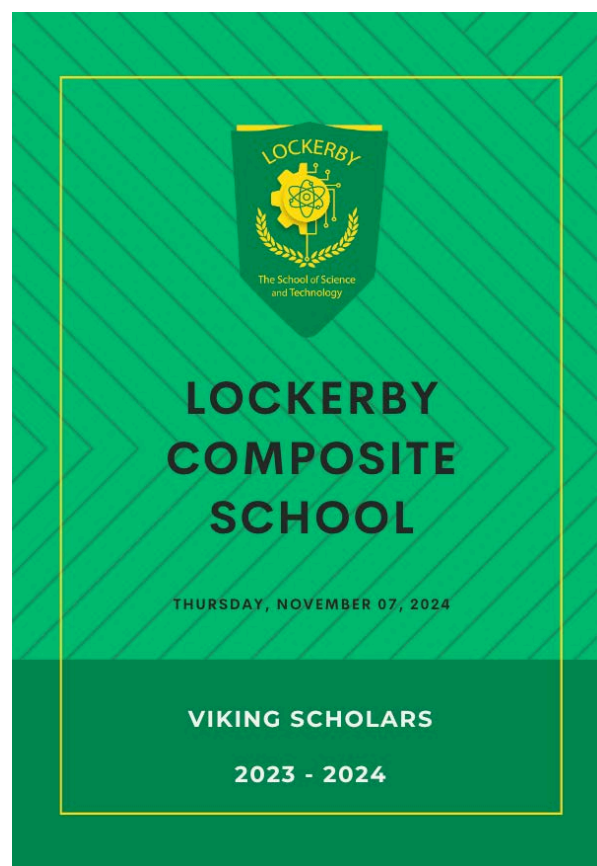
WISE (Women in Science and Engineering) Career Event - Wednesday, October 23rd, 2024

#### Schulich Leader Scholarship

Schulich Leader Scholarships are Canada's most coveted undergraduate STEM scholarships. One hundred are awarded to entrepreneurial-minded high school graduates enrolling in a Science, Technology, Engineering or Mathematics program at 20 partner universities across Canada. Half are valued at \$120,000 for engineering scholarships and half are valued at \$100,000 for science and mathematics scholarships. Every high school in Canada can nominate one graduating student each year to apply for the scholarship. Students who would like to be considered for this year's award are asked to complete a student activity sheet and submit the completed form by Wednesday, October 30th, 2024, to Student Services.

#### Galapagos Islands and Machu Picchu Tour – August 2025

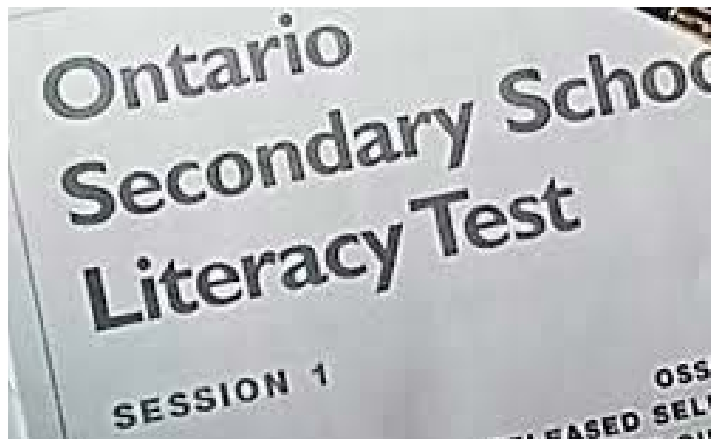

**Let's be respectful of choice, safety, equity and inclusion on Halloween.**

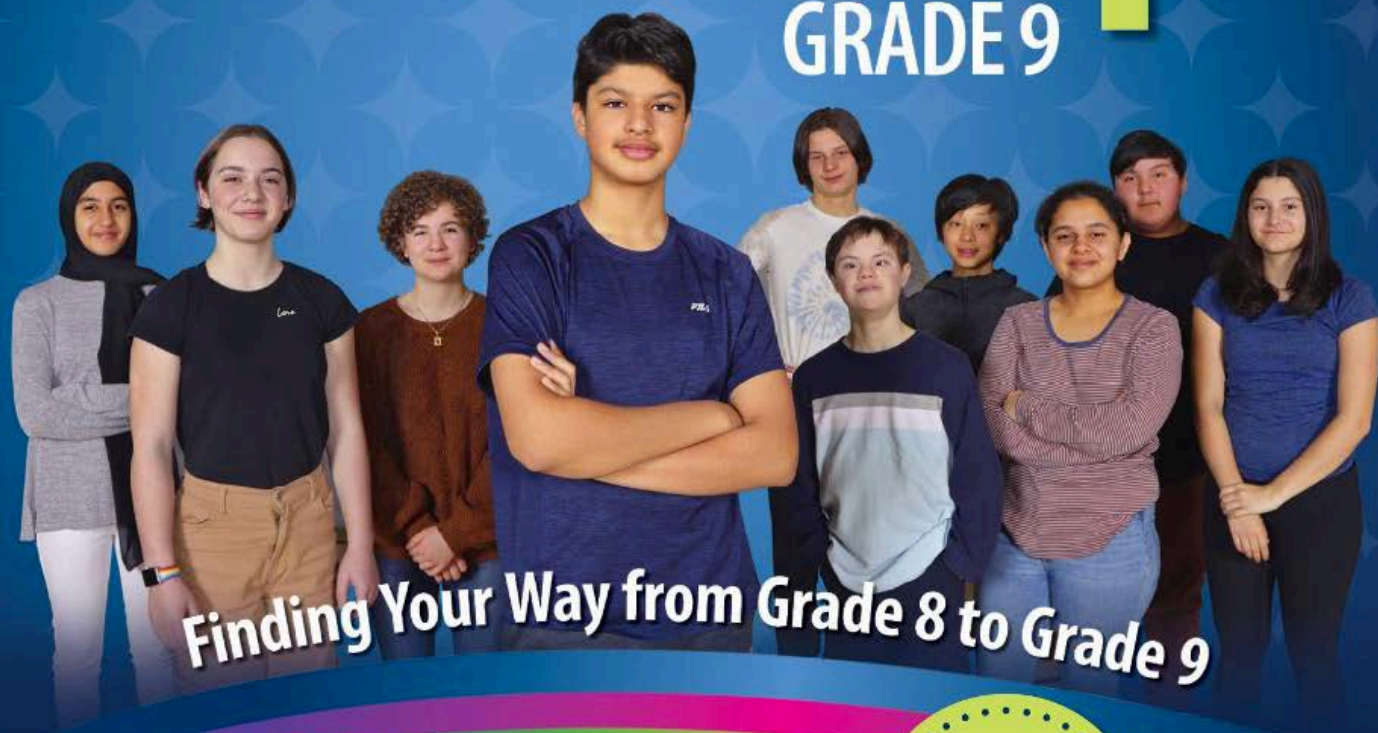

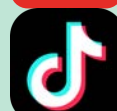
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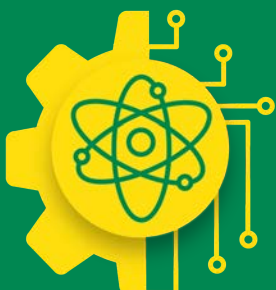

## THE SCHOOL OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY HOME TO 'STEP'
