Post Secondary Applications

Applications for university and college are now open. Grade 12s are encouraged to be finalizing their plans for where they would like to apply for Fall 2025 intake. Students can research various university programs throughout Ontario as well as complete their applications at - https://www.ontariouniversitiesinfo.ca/. Students can research various colleges programs throughout Ontario as well as complete their applications at - https://www.ontariocolleges.ca/en/

Many of our students have completed and paid for their applications to post-secondary institutions at this time. This message is a reminder that the applications have specific deadlines; it is essential for students to meet these deadlines in order to be considered for their chosen program. It is also important to note that the institutions will not receive any information until applications have been paid.

Early conditional offers are starting to be provided to our students. To be considered for this first-round of offers, students must complete and pay for their application prior to the Christmas Break.

Post-Secondary Application Deadlines

University: Wednesday, January 15th, 2025 (\$156.00 fee for 3 programs) College: Saturday, February 1st, 2025 (\$125.00 fee for 5 programs)

Midterm Mark Transmission to Colleges and Universities

The Rainbow District School Board sent marks to colleges (OCAS) and universities (OUAC) on Wednesday, November 13th, 2024. Students should review the transmission carefully to ensure the details are accurate. Special attention should be taken with regards to course codes and midterm marks. If there are any errors or questions please email Mrs. Beaudry. It is important to note that students will not be able to see the marks transmission until they pay for their post secondary application.

Post Secondary Virtual Fall Fair - Thursday, November 21st, 2024



Re: Vaccines required for school attendance

Public Health Sudbury & Districts (Public Health) collects and maintains up to date immunization records for every student in our service area, as required by the *Immunization of School Pupils Act* (ISPA). Students who are not up to date with their immunizations or do not have a valid exemption may face suspension from school. Starting in January 2025, Public Health will begin checking student immunization records. If any information is missing for your child, Public Health will contact you.

What do parents/guardians need to do?

- Be proactive and check to make sure your child's immunization record is up to date. If you are unsure, you can ask your health care provider or check online at <u>sdhu.icon.ehealthontario.ca</u>.
- Book an appointment with your health care provider if your child is overdue for any vaccines. If you do not have a health care provider, please contact Public Health.
- Report any vaccines your child has received from a health care
 provider, so their record stays up to date. Health care providers do
 not always notify Public Health when they administer a vaccine.
 Note: vaccines received at a school clinic do not need to be reported
 to Public Health.

Immunization records required to attend school in Ontario

Children who follow the <u>routine childhood immunization schedule</u> will get all the vaccines they need, at the right times, to attend school. Students in elementary and secondary schools must have either proof of immunization for the following diseases, or documentation of an exemption for any vaccine not received:

- diphtheria
- tetanus
- pertussis (whooping cough)
- polio
- measles
- mumps

- rubella
- meningococcal disease (meningitis)
- varicella (chicken pox), for children born in 2010 or later

How to access and report vaccines

 Online: You can view and report your child's immunizations through the Immunization Connect Ontario (ICON) tool. Visit <u>sdhu.icon.ehealthontario.ca</u> or scan the QR code provided.



- Email: Send a photo of the immunization record to ispa@phsd.ca. (Please note: email isn't always secure and can be vulnerable to the privacy of your child's immunization record being compromised).
- In person: Bring a copy of the immunization record to any Public Health office location during regular business hours.
