BUSINESS STUDIES




NEWS FROM THE WOODSHOP

This past week, our Construction Technology students continued their fine work in building an outhouse. Two of four walls are up, but there's still a ways to go before project completion - keep up the good work!




MARVELOUS MEIOSIS




PHOTOGRAPHY

BEAVER COMPUTING CHALLENGE

On Thursday, twenty of our Grade 9 and 10 Vikings joined thousands of other students from around the world and participated in the University of Waterloo's annual Beaver Computing Challenge (BCC). The competition involved having students attempt to solve 15 challenging mathematics and computing problems in a limited amount of time.

GRADE 11 HEALTH CARE

Grade 11 Health Care students wrapped-up their latest unit this week, with a hands-on skin assessment laboratory. Our Vikings had to record patients signs and symptoms, including shape, arrangement, distribution, colour and morphology of skin ailments, as well as having to predict the probability of developing a pressure injury.






