

#### **GRADE 10 BUSINESS**



In order to determine historical metal deposition, some of our Vikings are working with Dr. Gerard Courtin, a retired Biology and Forensic Botany professor, to core and ultimately analyze the wetland soils. First step - field work! These intrepid Vikings braved the chilly snowy conditions to get out and sample their study site. Next? Background research, and eventually laboratory work. Stay tuned!






## **STEP INTEGRATION**

This week, as part of STEP Integration, our Grade 9 students spent some time learning to code with the aid of micro:bits. The coding activity extended Vikings' understanding of wind turbines for renewable energy to smart farming and smart vehicles (using Climate Action Kit).










## HEALTH CARE

This week, health care students continued exploring the cardiovascular system using microscopes to analyze blood films. Students were able to identify red and white blood cells, create biological drawings, and examine how blood types are determined in order to solve a forensics murder case. Mr. Pitre shared his knowledge of blood typing and different opportunities in the laboratory technologist's scope. The week ended with a blood splatter digital laboratory that measured the sizes of blood drops and determined where a victim was in a room based on their findings.


### **MUSIC DEPARTMENT NEWS**

Applications for university and college are now open. Grade 12s are encouraged to be finalizing their plans for where they would like to apply for Fall 2025 intake. Many of our students have completed and paid for their applications to post-secondary institutions at this time. This message is a reminder that the applications have specific deadlines; it is essential for students to meet these deadlines in order to be considered for their chosen program. It is also important to note that the institutions will not receive any information until applications have been paid.

Early conditional offers are starting to be provided to our students. To be considered for this first-round of offers, students must complete and pay for their application prior to the Christmas Break.




