## **GRADE 10 CANADIAN HISTORY**

This week, Grade 10 students explored the impact of the Cold War on Canada, with a special focus on how the building and eventual fall of the Berlin Wall symbolized global tensions and divisions. To bring history to life, the class transformed their learning into a hands-on project - they created graffiti art representing the themes of freedom, division, and unity. These student artworks were then placed on a symbolic 'Berlin Wall' that divided the classroom, helping Vikings better understand the emotional and political significance of this historical era!

The Lockerby Pickleball Club held its third session today in the Main Gym after school last week. New players of all skill levels are welcome!









#### Post-Secondary

#### University Applications - Important Dates

As of Thursday, May 29th, 2025 every student who has applied to a university program will have received a response from an Ontario university. A response will be either i), an offer, ii) a refusal, or iii) a deferral pending the receipt of specific additional information. By Monday, June 2nd 2025, Ontario universities require a response to an offer and most likely a financial commitment (e.g., registration deposit, residence deposit, etc.). Note that all other admissions-related elements including scholarships, student assistance or financial incentives, and residence are part of the offer of admission.

Students must also log into their OUAC accounts to accept their offers; this is a multi-step process. Students will receive a confirmation number once all of the steps in the process are completed. A video tutorial for online responses is available on the OUAC website. This video demonstrates the steps required to respond to a university offer of admission. (https://www.ouac.on.ca/ugrad-tutorials/#respond). When you successfully complete the submission process, you will immediately receive a confirmation number online. You will also receive the confirmation number by email along with a summary of your responses to offers of admission and/or changes to your application information. Important: if you do not immediately receive a confirmation number, your response was not saved. You then must log back into your online application and re-submit your response.

#### <u>OSAP Applications OSAP - (https://osap.gov.on.ca)</u>

Once students have decided on the post-secondary college or university they want to attend, they can then apply for OSAP (if desired). This year, the application form is considered to be more user-friendly! Students with questions linked to OSAP are encouraged to contact the Financial Aid Office of the post-secondary institution they plan to attend.

During the first seven days of the program, Period 1 classes will run from 8:00am to 10:30am and Period 2 classes from 10:45am to 1:15pm. Class times change on the eighth day until the end of Summer School. They then run from 8:30am to 10:30am and from 10:45am to 12:45pm

#### New Credit eLearning Courses

- eLearning is taught entirely through the Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) in D2L's Brightspace. eLearning is asynchronous, which means students have the flexibility to login and complete work at any time of the day.
- Students should expect to spend approximately five hours per day working on their course. Extensions will NOT
  be provided for personal vacations where the student is not able to participate in the course. There is no
  guarantee students will be able to access the VLE outside of Canada.
- Students are permitted to enroll in only ONE summer eLearning course.
- Students should see their guidance counsellor for a complete list of available courses and to register.

#### **Credit Recovery or Upgrading Courses**

- Classes will take place in person at Sudbury Secondary School's Adult Day School and are open to students from both public and separate schools.
- Schedule:
  - Period 1: 8 am to 10:30 am
  - Period 2: 10:45 am to 1:15 pm

#### New Credit Co-op Courses

- July 2 to July 31, 2025 (1 or 2 Credit) | August 1 to August 22, 2025 (additional credit)
- Co-op will be available to those students who already have a paid or unpaid placement where the employer has agreed to monitor.
