

<u>University Applications - Important Dates</u>

As of Thursday, May 29th, 2025 every student who has applied to a university program will have received a response from an Ontario university. A response will be either i), an offer, ii) a refusal, or iii) a deferral pending the receipt of specific additional information. By Monday, June 2nd 2025, Ontario universities require a response to an offer and most likely a financial commitment (e.g., registration deposit, residence deposit, etc.). Note that all other admissions-related elements including scholarships, student assistance or financial incentives, and residence are part of the offer of admission.

Students must also log into their OUAC accounts to accept their offers; this is a multi-step process. Students will receive a confirmation number once all of the steps in the process are completed. A video tutorial for online responses is available on the OUAC website. This video demonstrates the steps required to respond to a university offer of admission. (https://www.ouac.on.ca/ugrad-tutorials/#respond). When you successfully complete the submission process, you will immediately receive a confirmation number online. You will also receive the confirmation number by email along with a summary of your responses to offers of admission and/or changes to your application information.lmportant: if you do not immediately receive a confirmation number, your response was not saved. You then must log back into your online application and re-submit your response.

RDSB Summer School - Registrations Are Now Available

Rainbow Schools Summer Learning Program will offer new credit eLearning courses, Co-Op, Credit Recovery, and upgrading courses. Courses will run from July 2 - July 31. An additional Co-Op credit in August will run from August 1 - August 22. Students who are interested in registering for Summer School are asked to see Ms. Baggs or Mrs. Beaudry in the Student Services Office. Students can register before Friday, June 20th, 2025. The last day to register for Summer School is Wednesday, July 2nd, 2025, by contacting the Summer School Principal directly at rdsbsummerschool@rainbowschools.ca.

Credit recovery and upgrading courses for the Sudbury area will run in-person at Sudbury Secondary School, in the Adult Education wing. During the first seven days of the program, Period 1 classes will run from 8:00am to 10:30am and Period 2 classes from 10:45am to 1:15pm. Class times change on the eighth day until the end of Summer School. They then run from 8:30am to 10:30am and from 10:45am to 12:45pm

New Credit eLearning Courses

- eLearning is taught entirely through the Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) in D2L's Brightspace. eLearning is
 asynchronous, which means students have the flexibility to login and complete work at any time of the day.
- Students should expect to spend approximately five hours per day working on their course. Extensions will NOT
 be provided for personal vacations where the student is not able to participate in the course. There is no
 guarantee students will be able to access the VLE outside of Canada.
- Students are permitted to enroll in only ONE summer eLearning course.
- Students should see their guidance counsellor for a complete list of available courses and to register.

Credit Recovery or Upgrading Courses

- Classes will take place in person at Sudbury Secondary School's Adult Day School and are open to students from both public and separate schools.
- Schedule:
 - Period 1: 8 am to 10:30 am
 - Period 2: 10:45 am to 1:15 pm

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New Credit Co-op Courses

- July 2 to July 31, 2025 (1 or 2 Credit) | August 1 to August 22, 2025 (additional credit)
- Co-op will be available to those students who already have a paid or unpaid placement where the employer
 has agreed to monitor.
