
















VISUAL ART


THIS WEEK IN VIKING ATHLETICS...

A message from Mr. Lafraniere and Mr. Smith to all students, parents/guardians, staff, and community members:



Final Examinations

School Item Returns

Lockerby Composite School has loaned several materials to our Vikings students this past school year. We are asking that all of these loaned items now be returned to the school. If students have final examinations next week, they can return all items then. In order to prepare for the next school year, students are required to return items such as:



- technology (eg. iPads, chromebooks, cameras, etc.)
- textbooks / English books
- laboratory equipment
- woodworking, auto, and technological equipment
- physical education equipment/sportswear
- borrowed visual arts supplies
- musical instruments
- Library books

Lockers



STUDENT SERVICES

Rainbow Schools Summer Learning Program will offer new credit eLearning courses, Co-Op, Credit Recovery, and upgrading courses. Courses will run from July 2 - July 31. An additional Co-op credit in August will run from August 1 - August 22. Students who are interested in registering for Summer School are asked to see Ms. Baggs or Mrs. Beaudry in the Student Services Office. The last day to register for Summer School is Wednesday, July 2nd, 2025, by contacting the Summer School Principal directly at rdsbsummerschool@rainbowschools.ca.

Credit recovery and upgrading courses for the Sudbury area will run in-person at Sudbury Secondary School, in the Adult Education wing. During the first seven days of the program, Period 1 classes will run from 8:00am to 10:30am and Period 2 classes from 10:45am to 1:15pm. Class times change on the eighth day until the end of Summer School. They then run from 8:30am to 10:30am and from 10:45am to 12:45pm. School Board transportation is not provided for Summer School. New Credit eLearning Courses

- eLearning is taught entirely through the Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) in D2L's Brightspace. eLearning is
 asynchronous, which means students have the flexibility to login and complete work at any time of the day.
- Students should expect to spend approximately five hours per day working on their course. Extensions will NOT
 be provided for personal vacations where the student is not able to participate in the course. There is no
 guarantee students will be able to access the VLE outside of Canada.
- Students are permitted to enroll in only ONE summer eLearning course.
