SKILLS ONTARIO

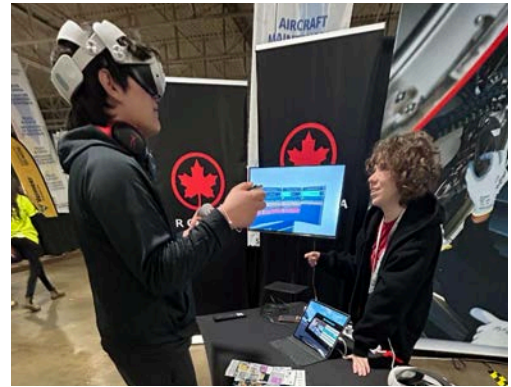

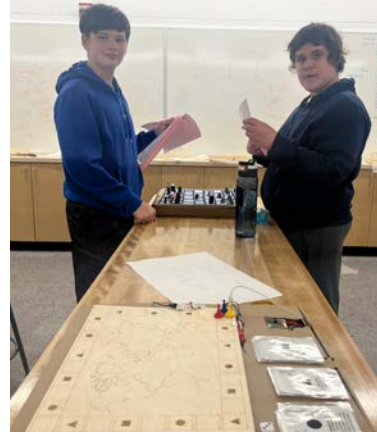

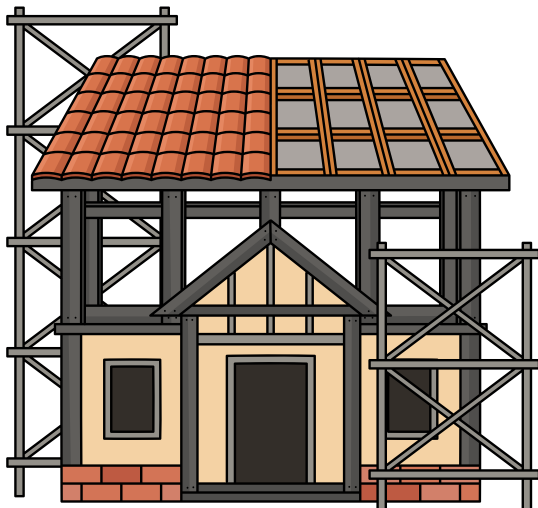
GRADE 9 STEP INTEGRATION

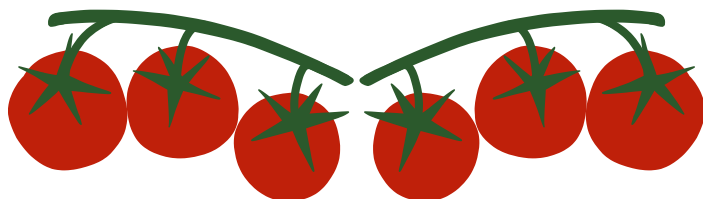

Midterm Mark Transmission to Colleges and Universities

The Rainbow District School Board sent marks to colleges (OCAS) and universities (OUAC) on Thursday, April 23rd, 2026. Graduating students should review the transmission carefully to ensure the details are accurate. Special attention should be taken with regard to course codes and midterm marks. If there are any errors or questions, please email Ms. Baggs or Mrs. Beaudry.

Accept Your College Offer – Friday, May 1st, 2026

Students should accept their college offer by Friday, May 1st, 2026, to save their seat in their chosen program. If a program is over-subscribed and there is a waitlist, students risk losing their place in the program if they do not adhere to this deadline. Students can accept their programs on the Ontario College Application website - ontariocolleges.ca.

University Applications - Important Dates As of Friday, May 29th, 2026

As of Friday, May 29th, 2026, every student who has applied to a university program will have received a response from an Ontario university. A response will be either i) an offer, ii) a refusal, or iii) a deferral pending the receipt of specific additional information. By Monday, June 1st, 2026, Ontario universities require a response to an offer and most likely a financial commitment (e.g., registration deposit, residence deposit, etc.). Note that all other admissions-related elements, including scholarships, student assistance or financial incentives, and residence, are part of the offer of admission. Students must also log into their OUAC accounts to accept their offers; this is a multi-step process. Students will receive a confirmation number once all of the steps in the process are completed. A video tutorial for online responses is available on the OUAC website. This video demonstrates the steps required to respond to a university offer of admission. When complete the submission process is complete, a confirmation number will be sent by email along with a summary of responses to offers of admission and/or changes to your application information.

The event will begin at 5:00pm and will welcome hundreds of high school students, parents/guardians, teachers and community members to celebrate the achievements of Aboriginal youth in our communities. Students who self-identify as Indigenous and are currently in Grades 11 or 12 and who would like to attend the event are asked to see Ms. Baggs or Mrs. Beaudry.

Accessible Collete Transition - Summer 2026

The Accessible College Transition (ACT) course, beginning on Tuesday, July 6th, is offered by NOARC through Cambrian College. This free course is designed to help students with special education needs prepare for post-secondary studies. Students who complete this 8-week course will earn 3 general education credits at Cambrian College. This course is open to Sudbury and area students planning on attending postsecondary studies in the coming year at any college or university. However, the credit is only valid at Cambrian College. Rainbow Schools Summer Programming

Overview

Rainbow District School Board's Summer Learning Program will offer new credit e-learning courses, co-op, credit recovery and upgrading courses. Courses will run from July 2nd to July 31st. An additional co-op credit in August will run from August 1st to August 21st.

Credit Recovery or Upgrading Courses

Credit recovery and upgrading courses for the Sudbury area will run in-person at Sudbury Secondary School, in the Adult Education wing.

During the first seven days of the program, Period 1 classes will run from 8:00am to 10:30am and Period 2 classes from 10:45am to 1:15pm. Class times change on the 8th day until the end of Summer School. They then run from 8:30am to 10:30am and 10:45am to 12:45pm.

A list of tentative course offerings can be found on the Student Services Google Classroom. Courses offered are subject to sufficient student enrolment and teacher availability.

Indigenous Education

Rainbow District School Board's Indigenous Summer Learning Program will offer Civics and Careers and Physical Education at Sudbury Secondary School and Civics and Careers only at Manitoulin Secondary School. Courses will run from July 2nd - July 20th.



Secondary Summer Learning Program

July 2 to 31, 2026

New Credit eLearning Courses

- Learning is taught entirely through the Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) in QEL's Brightspace. Learning is asynchronous, which means students have the flexibility to login and complete work at any time of the day.
- Students should expect to spend approximately five hours per day working on their course. Extensions will NOT be provided for personal vacations where the student is not able to participate in the course. There is no guarantee students will be able to access the VLE outside of Canada.
- Students are permitted to enroll in only ONE summer eLearning course.
- Students should see their guidance counsellor for a complete list of available courses and to register.

Credit Recovery or Upgrading Courses

- Classes will take place in person at Sudbury Secondary School's Adult Day School and are open to students from both public and separate schools.

- Period 2: 10:45 am to 1:15 pm



New Credit Co-op Courses

- July 2 to July 31, 2026 (1 or 2 Credit) | August 1 to August 21, 2026 (additional credit)
- Co-op will be available to those students who already have a paid or unpaid placement where the employer has agreed to monitor.

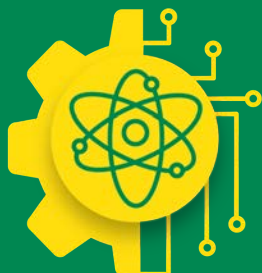
