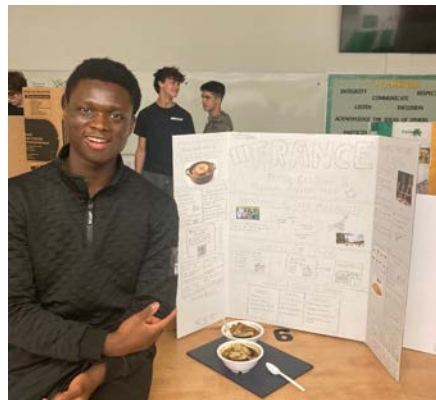
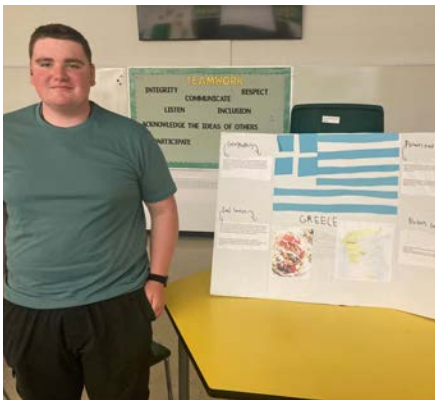

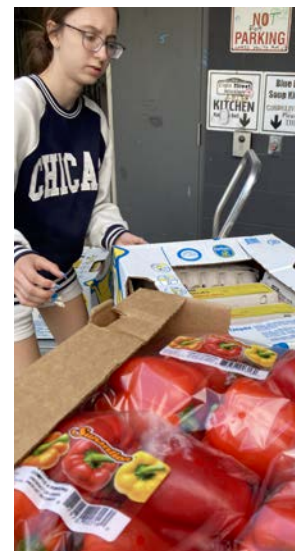
COOKING-UP A STORM!

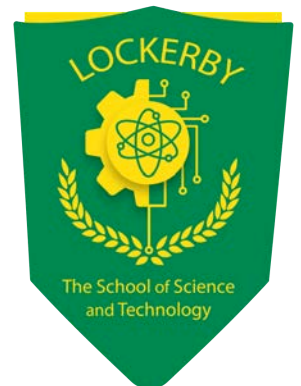




SCHOOL COUNCIL SURVEY

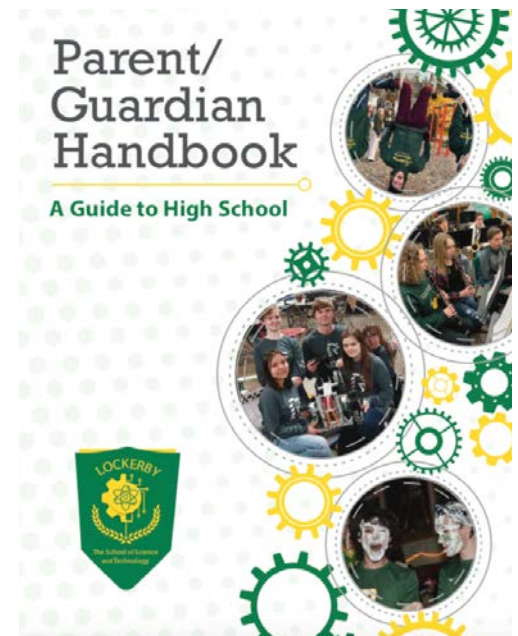

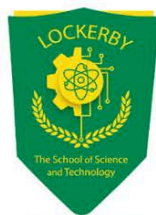

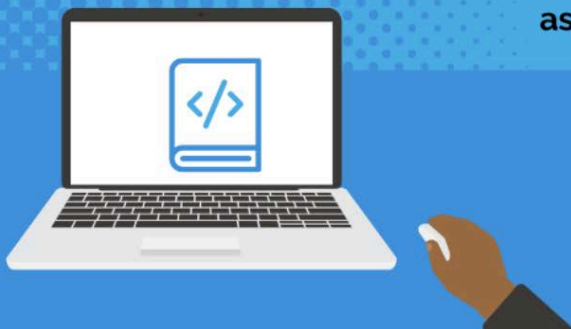

Rainbow Schools Summer Programming

Rainbow District School Board's Summer Learning Program will offer new credit e-learning courses, co-op, credit recovery and upgrading courses. Courses will run from July 2nd to July 31st. An additional co-op credit in August will run from August 1st to August 21st. Credit recovery and upgrading courses for the Sudbury area will run in-person at Sudbury Secondary School, in the Adult Education wing. During the first seven days of the program, Period 1 classes will run from 8:00am to 10:30am and Period 2 classes from 10:45am to 1:15pm. Class times change on the 8th day until the end of Summer School. They then run from 8:30am to 10:30am and 10:45am to 12:45pm. A list of tentative course offerings can be found on the Student Services Google Classroom. Courses offered are subject to sufficient student enrolment and teacher availability. Rainbow District School Board's Indigenous Summer Learning Program will offer Civics and Careers and Physical Education at Sudbury Secondary School and Civics and Careers only at Manitoulin Secondary School. Courses will run from July 2nd - July 20th.

New Credit eLearning Courses


- eLearning is taught entirely through the Virtual Learning Environment (VLE) in D2L's Brightspace. eLearning is asynchronous, which means students have the flexibility to login and complete work at any time of the day.
- Students should expect to spend approximately five hours per day working on their course. Extensions will NOT be provided for personal vacations where the student is not able to participate in the course. There is no guarantee students will be able to access the VLE outside of Canada.
- Students are permitted to enroll in only ONE summer eLearning course.
- Students should see their guidance counsellor for a complete list of available courses and to register.

Credit Recovery or Upgrading Courses


- Classes will take place in person at Sudbury Secondary School's Adult Day School and are open to students from both public and separate schools.

- Period 1: 8 am to 10:30 am
- Period 2: 10:45 am to 1:15 pm



New Credit Co-op Courses



- July 2 to July 31, 2026 (1 or 2 Credit) | August 1 to August 21, 2026 (additional credit)
- Co-op will be available to those students who already have a paid or unpaid placement where the employer has agreed to monitor.

Time to boost protection!

Your child may be due for their Tdap booster, an important vaccine that protects against tetanus, diphtheria, and pertussis. This booster is recommended 10 years after routine vaccines given between ages 4 and 6.

This vaccine is also required under the *Immunization of School Pupils Act (ISPA)*.

What You Can Do



Check your child's immunization records (they may be eligible for other vaccines) and update their records on [Immunization Connect Ontario \(ICON\)](#).



If they are due for their booster, book an appointment with a health care provider and report the vaccine directly to [Public Health](#) or use the link above.



Keeping immunizations up to date helps protect your child and the school community.

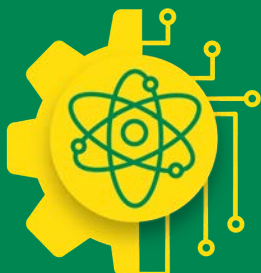
